

DSWD DROMIC Report #5 on the Severe Tropical Storm “Kristine” as of 23 October 2024, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

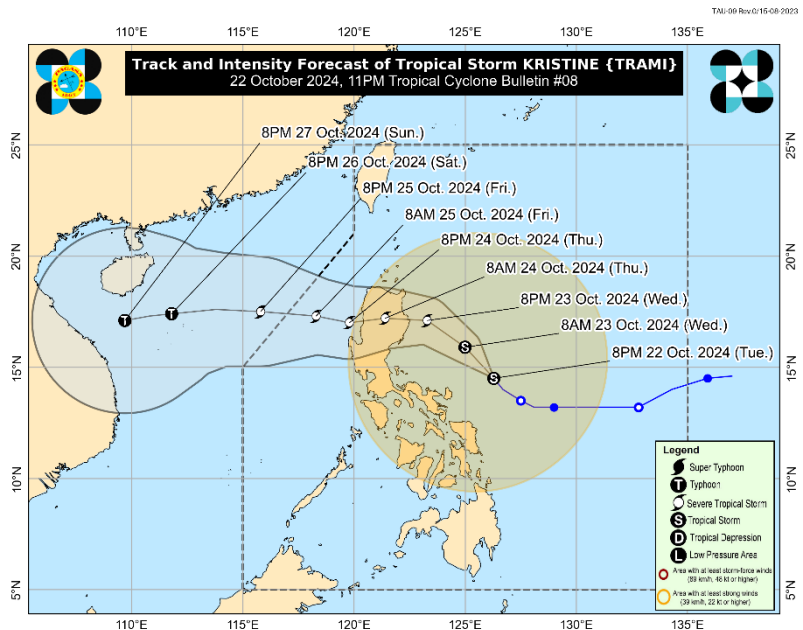
Issued on 23 October 2024 at 5PM, “Kristine” has intensified into a severe tropical storm.

HAZARDS AFFECTING LAND AREAS

Heavy Rainfall Outlook

Refer to Weather Advisory No. 14 issued at 5:00 PM today for the heavy rainfall outlook due to “Kristine”.

Severe Winds



The wind signals warn the public of the general wind threat over an area due to the tropical cyclone. Local winds may be slightly stronger/enhanced in coastal and upland/mountainous areas exposed to winds. Winds are less strong in areas sheltered from the prevailing wind direction.

- Moderate to significant impacts from storm-force winds are possible within any of the localities where Wind Signal No. 3 is hoisted.
- Minor to moderate impacts from gale-force winds are possible within any of the localities where Wind Signal No. 2 is hoisted
- Minimal to minor impacts from strong winds are possible within any of the areas under Wind Signal No. 1.

Furthermore, the wind flow coming towards the circulation of “Kristine” and the Northeasterly Windflow will also bring strong to gale-force gusts over the following areas (especially in coastal and upland areas exposed to winds):

- Today (23 October): MIMAROPA, Visayas, and Mindanao.
- Tomorrow (24 October): MIMAROPA, Bicol Region, Visayas, Basilan, Sulu, Tawi-Tawi, Zamboanga del Norte, Lanao del Sur, Northern Mindanao, Dinagat Islands, Surigao del Norte, Davao del Sur, and Davao Oriental.
- Friday (25 October): MIMAROPA, Bicol Region, Western Visayas, Negros Occidental, Zamboanga del Norte, Basilan, Sulu, and Tawi-Tawi.

Coastal Inundation

There is a moderate to significant risk of life-threatening storm surge in the next 48 hours over the low-lying or exposed coastal localities of Ilocos Norte, Ilocos Sur, La Union, Pangasinan, Cagayan, Isabela, Zambales, Aurora, and Quezon.

HAZARD AFFECTING COASTAL WATERS

A Gale Warning is hoisted over the seaboard of Luzon and Visayas.

24-Hour Sea Condition Outlook

Up to high seas over the following coastal waters:

- Up to 8.0 m: The seaboard of Cagayan Valley, Ilocos Region, and Zambales.
- Up to 6.0 m: The western seaboard of Bataan; the seaboard of Lubang Island.
- Up to 5.5 m: the western seaboard of Batangas, Occidental Mindoro including Lubang Islands, and Calamian Islands.
- Sea travel is risky for all types or tonnage of vessels. All mariners must remain in port or, if underway, seek shelter or safe harbor as soon as possible until winds and waves subside.

Up to very rough seas over the following coastal waters:

- Up to 4.5 m: The seaboard of Aurora, Polillo Islands, Camarines Norte; the northern and eastern seaboard of Catanduanes; the northern seaboard of Camarines Sur.
- Sea travel is risky for all types or tonnage of vessels. All mariners must remain in port or, if underway, seek shelter or safe harbor as soon as possible until winds and waves subside.

Up to rough seas over the following coastal waters:

- Up to 4.0 m: The seaboard of Cuyo Islands; the western seaboard of mainland Palawan, Western Visayas, Negros Occidental, and Negros Oriental.
- Up to 3.5 m: The remaining seaboard of Luzon and Visayas.
- Up to 3.0 m: The seaboard of Dinagat Islands, Camiguin, and Zamboanga del Norte; the northern and western seaboard of Surigao del Norte.
- Mariners of small seacrafts, including all types of motorbancas, are advised not to venture out to sea under these conditions, especially if inexperienced or operating ill-equipped vessels.

Up to moderate seas over the following coastal waters:

- Up to 2.5 m: The remaining seaboard of Mindanao.
- Mariners of motorbancas and similarly-sized vessels are advised to take precautionary measures while venturing out to sea and, if possible, avoid navigation under these conditions.

TRACK AND INTENSITY OUTLOOK

- “Kristine” is forecast to move generally northwestward for the next 12 hours before turning generally westward for the rest of the forecast period. It is forecast to make

landfall over Isabela tonight or tomorrow (24 October) early morning. It will then cross the mountainous terrain of Northern Luzon and emerge over the waters west of Ilocos Region tomorrow morning. “Kristine” may exit the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR) region on Friday (25 October).

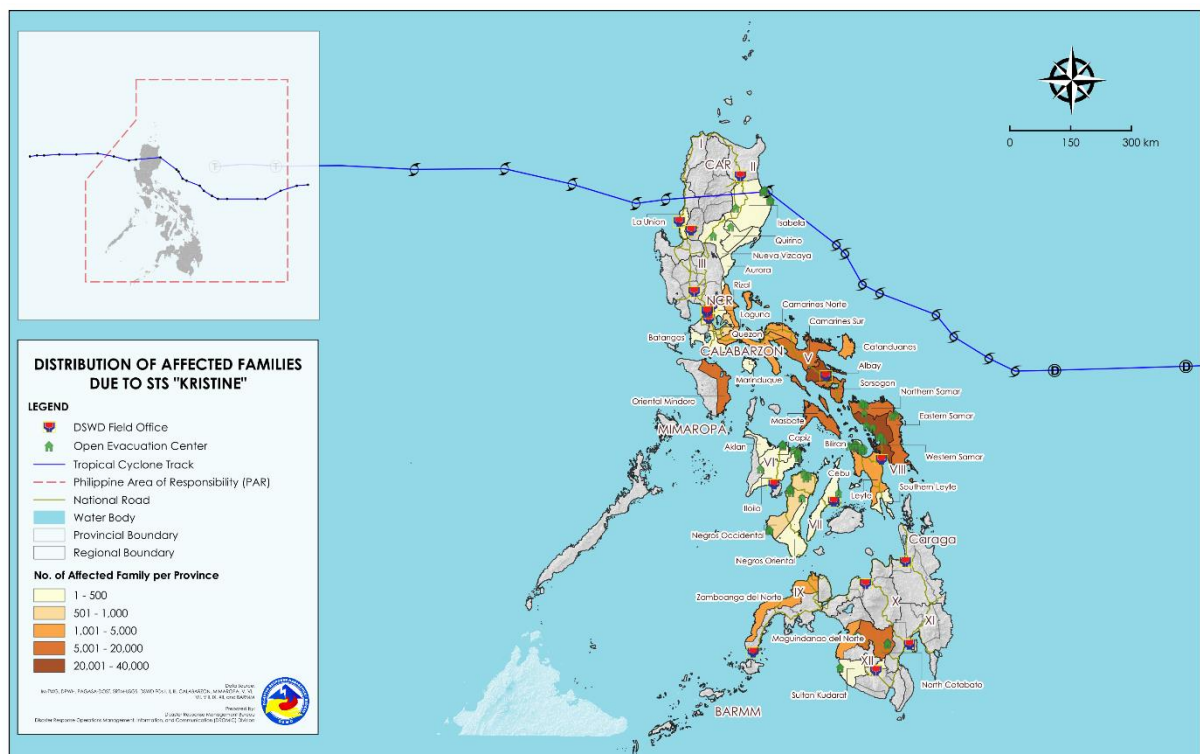
- “Kristine” is forecast to further intensify until it makes landfall. Slight weakening will occur while crossing Northern Luzon. Re-intensification may occur over the West Philippine Sea.

The center of the eye of Severe Tropical Storm “Kristine” was estimated based on all available data at 175 km East of Echague, Isabela (16.5 °N, 123.3 °E) moving Westward at 20 km/h with a maximum sustained winds of 95 km/h near the center and gustiness of up to 115 km/h.

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **144,098 families** or **575,599 persons** are affected in **1,169 barangays** in **Regions I, II, III, CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, V, VI, VII, VIII, IX, XII** and **BARMM** (see Annex A).



III. Status of Displaced Population

a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are **7,927 families** or **29,527 persons** currently taking temporary shelter in **630 evacuation centers** in **Regions II, III, CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, V, VI, VII, VIII, IX, and XII** (see Annex B).

b. Outside Evacuation Center

There are **6,576 families** or **27,632 persons** temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex E).

c. Total Displaced Population

There are **14,503 families** or **57,159 persons** still displaced in **Regions II, III, CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, V, VI, VII, VIII, IX, and XII** (see Annex F).

IV. Damaged Houses

A total of **208 houses** were damaged; of which, **50** are **totally damaged** and **158** are **partially damaged** in **Regions I, V, VI, VIII, IX and XII** (see Annex G).

V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of **₱46,940,142.26** worth of assistance was provided to the affected families composed of **₱46,128,248.99** from **DSWD**, **₱725,393.27** from the **Local Government Units (LGUs)**, and **₱86,500.00** from **other Partners** (see Annex H).
