

DSWD DROMIC Report #6 on the Severe Tropical Storm “Kristine”

as of 24 October 2024, 6AM

I. Situation Overview

Issued on 24 October 2024 at 5AM, “Kristine” gradually decelerates while moving northwestward over Northern Luzon.

HAZARDS AFFECTING LAND AREAS

Heavy Rainfall Outlook

Refer to Weather Advisory No. 18 issued at 5:00 AM today for the heavy rainfall outlook due to “KRISTINE”.

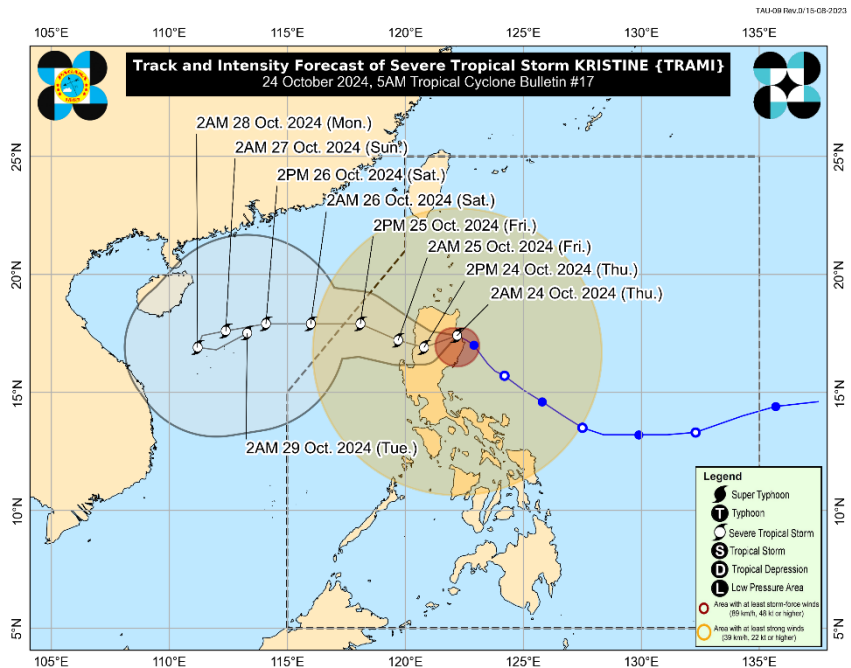
Severe Winds

The wind signals warn the public of the general wind threat over an area due to the tropical cyclone. Local winds may be slightly stronger/enhanced in coastal and upland/mountainous areas exposed to winds. Winds are less strong in areas sheltered from the prevailing wind direction.

- Moderate to significant impacts from storm-force winds are possible within any of the localities where Wind Signal No. 3 is hoisted.
- Minor to moderate impacts from gale-force winds are possible within any of the localities where Wind Signal No. 2 is hoisted
- Minimal to minor impacts from strong winds are possible within any of the areas under Wind Signal No. 1.

Furthermore, the wind flow coming towards the circulation of KRISTINE and the Northeasterly Windflow will also bring strong to gale-force gusts over the following areas (especially in coastal and upland areas exposed to winds):

- Today (24 October): MIMAROPA, Bicol Region, Visayas, Basilan, Sulu, Tawi-Tawi, Zamboanga del Norte, Lanao del Sur, Northern Mindanao, Dinagat Islands, Surigao del Norte, Davao del Sur, and Davao Oriental.
- Tomorrow (25 October): MIMAROPA, Bicol Region, Western Visayas, Negros Occidental, Siquijor, Bohol, Southern Leyte, Zamboanga del Norte, Basilan, Sulu, Tawi-Tawi, Camiguin, and Dinagat Islands



- Saturday (26 October): MIMAROPA, Bicol Region, Western Visayas, Negros Occidental, Siquijor, Zamboanga del Norte, Camiguin, Dinagat Islands, Siargao and Bucas Grande Island Group.

Coastal Inundation

There is a moderate to high risk of life-threatening storm surge up to 3.0 m above normal tide levels in the next 48 hours over the low-lying or exposed coastal localities of Ilocos Norte, Ilocos Sur, La Union, Pangasinan, Cagayan, Isabela, Aurora, Zambales, and Quezon. For more information, refer to Storm Surge Warning No. 8 issued at 2:00 AM today.

HAZARD AFFECTING COASTAL WATERS

A Gale Warning is hoisted over the seaboard of Luzon and Visayas. For more information, refer to Gale Warning No. 8 issued at 5:00 AM today.

24-Hour Sea Condition Outlook

Up to very rough or high seas over the following coastal waters:

- Up to 8.0 m: The seaboard of Cagayan Valley, Ilocos Region, and Zambales.
- Up to 7.0 m: The western seaboard of Bataan.
- Up to 6.0 m: The western seaboard of Batangas; the seaboard of Lubang Island.
- Up to 5.5 m: The western seaboard of Occidental Mindoro and Calamian Islands.
- Up to 4.5 m: The seaboard of Aurora; the northern and eastern seaboard of Catanduanes; the northern seaboard of Camarines Sur; the western seaboard of Western Visayas, Negros Occidental, and mainland Palawan.
- Sea travel is risky for all types or tonnage of vessels. All mariners must remain in port or, if underway, seek shelter or safe harbor as soon as possible until winds and waves subside.

Up to rough seas over the following coastal waters:

- Up to 4.0 m: The seaboard of Cuyo Islands, Polillo Islands, Oriental Mindoro, Marinduque, Romblon, and Camarines Norte; the western seaboard of Quezon and Negros Oriental
- Up to 3.5 m: The remaining seaboard of Luzon and Visayas.
- Up to 3.0 m: The seaboard of Dinagat Islands, Camiguin, and Zamboanga del Norte; the northern and western seaboard of Surigao del Norte.
- Mariners of small seacrafts, including all types of motorbancas, are advised not to venture out to sea under these conditions, especially if inexperienced or operating ill-equipped vessels.

Up to moderate seas over the following coastal waters:

- Up to 2.5 m: The remaining seaboard of Mindanao.

- Mariners of motorbancas and similarly-sized vessels are advised to take precautionary measures while venturing out to sea and, if possible, avoid navigation under these conditions.

TRACK AND INTENSITY OUTLOOK

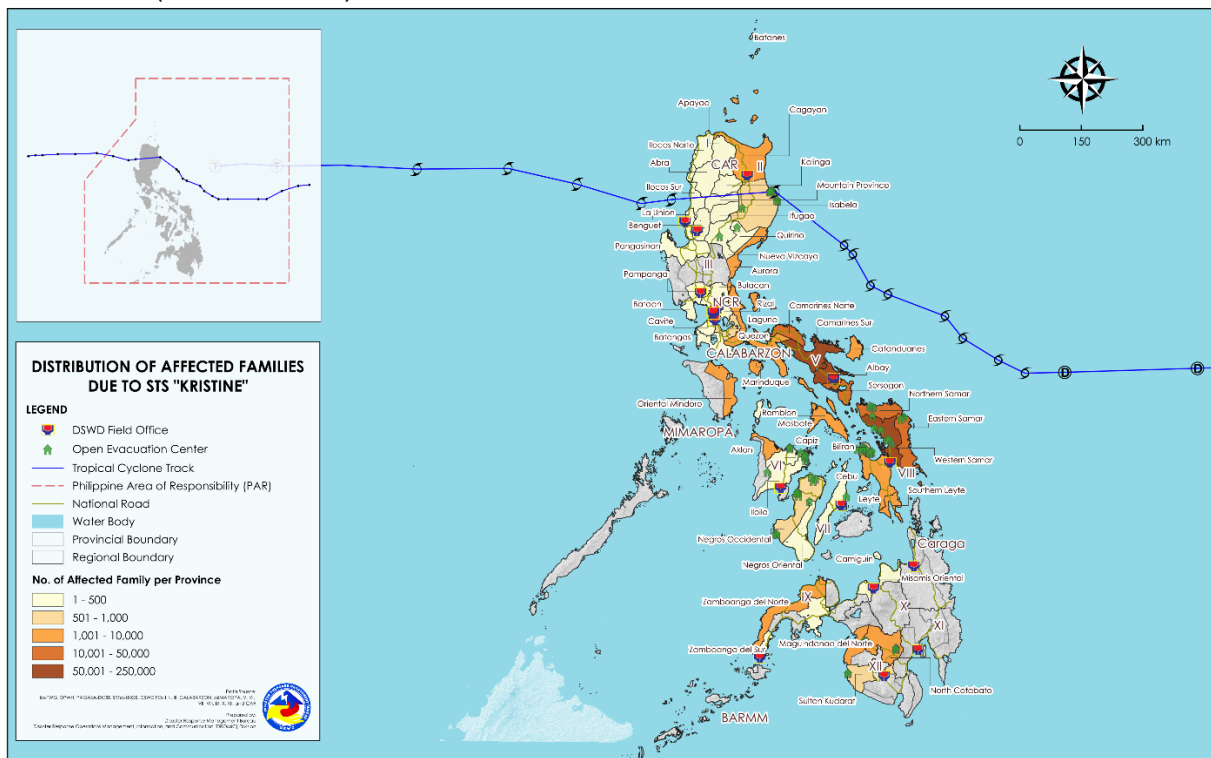
- “Kristine” is forecast to cross Northern Luzon over the next 12 hours and may emerge over the waters west of Ilocos Region this afternoon or evening. KRISTINE will then move west northwestward over the West Philippine Sea and exit the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR) region on tomorrow (25 October) afternoon.
- “Kristine” may slightly weaken while crossing Northern Luzon due to land interaction, with downgrading into a tropical storm not ruled out. However, re-intensification may occur once the tropical cyclone moves over the West Philippine Sea.

The center of the eye of Severe Tropical Storm “Kristine” was estimated based on all available data in the vicinity of Tumauni, Isabela (17.3 °N, 121.8 °E) moving West Northwestward at 15 km/h with a maximum sustained winds of 95 km/h near the center and gustiness of up to 160 km/h.

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **488,776 families** or **2,167,401 persons** are affected in **3,068 barangays** in **Regions I, II, III, CAR, CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, V, VI, VII, VIII, IX, X, XII** and **BARMM** (see Annex A).



III. Status of Displaced Population

a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are **48,492 families** or **174,226 persons** currently taking temporary shelter in **2,067 evacuation centers** in **Regions I, II, III, CAR, CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, V, VI, VII, VIII, IX, X, and XII** (see Annex B).

b. Outside Evacuation Center

There are **15,248 families** or **63,039 persons** temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex E).

c. Total Displaced Population

There are **63,740 families** or **237,265 persons** still displaced in **Regions I, II, III, CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, V, VI, VII, VIII, IX, X and XII** (see Annex F).

IV. Damaged Houses

A total of **427 houses** were damaged; of which, **65** are **totally damaged** and **362** are **partially damaged** in **Regions I, CAR, V, VI, VIII, IX, X and XII** (see Annex G).

V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of **₱56,715,553.34** worth of assistance was provided to the affected families composed of **₱55,284,894.07** from **DSWD**, **₱1,344,159.27** from the **Local Government Units (LGUs)**, and **₱86,500.00** from **other Partners** (see Annex H).
