

DSWD DROMIC Report #8 on Super Typhoon “Julian” as of 03 October 2024, 6AM

I. Situation Overview

Issued on 03 October 2024 at 5AM, “Julian” continues to weaken while slowly moving Northeastward towards Taiwan.

HAZARDS AFFECTING LAND AREAS

Severe Winds

The wind signals warn the public of the general wind threat over an area due to the tropical cyclone. Local winds may be slightly

stronger/enhanced in coastal and upland/mountainous areas exposed to winds. Winds are weaker in areas sheltered from the prevailing wind direction.

- Minimal to minor impacts from strong winds are possible within any of the areas under Wind Signal No. 1.

HAZARD AFFECTING COASTAL WATERS

A Gale Warning is hoisted over the northern seaboard of Northern Luzon. For more information, refer to Gale Warning No. 13 issued at 5:00 AM today.

24-Hour Sea Condition Outlook

Under the influence of Typhoon “Julian”, a Gale Warning is hoisted over the northern seaboard of Northern Luzon.

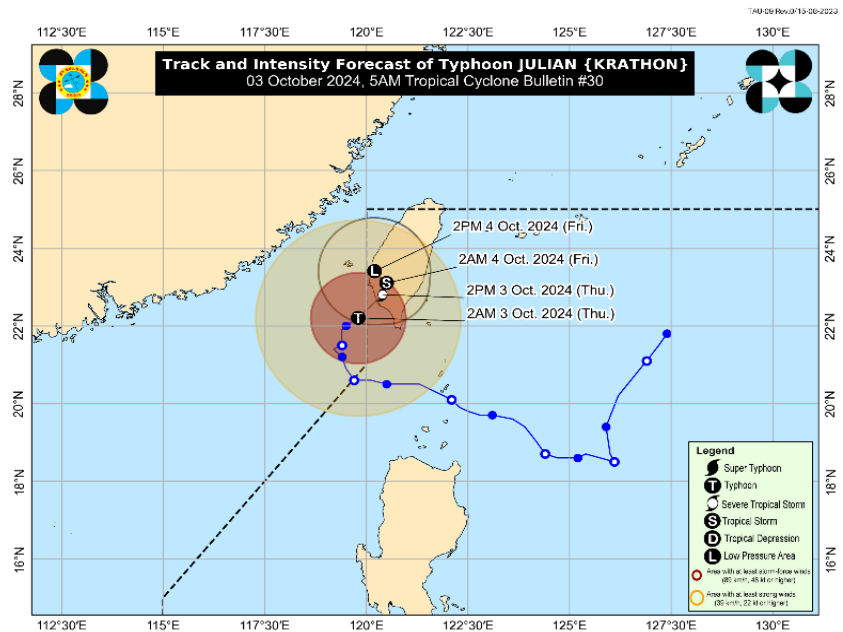
Very rough seas over the following coastal waters:

- Up to 4.5 m over the seaboard of Batanes.

Sea travel is risky for most types or tonnage of vessels, including all small seacrafts and motorbancas. Mariners are advised to remain in port or seek safe shelter or harbor.

Moderate or rough seas over the following coastal waters:

- Up to 4.0 m over the seaboard of Babuyan Islands and Ilocos Norte



- Up to 3.5 m over the remaining seaboard of Ilocos Region
- Up to 3.0 m over the seaboard of Zambales
- Up to 2.5 m over the remaining seaboard of Cagayan mainland Cagayan, the western seaboard of Lubang Island, the western seaboard of Calamian Islands, and the seaboard of Kalayaan Islands.

Mariners of small seacrafts, including all types of motorbancas, are advised not to venture out to sea under these conditions, especially if inexperienced or operating ill-equipped vessels.

TRACK AND INTENSITY OUTLOOK

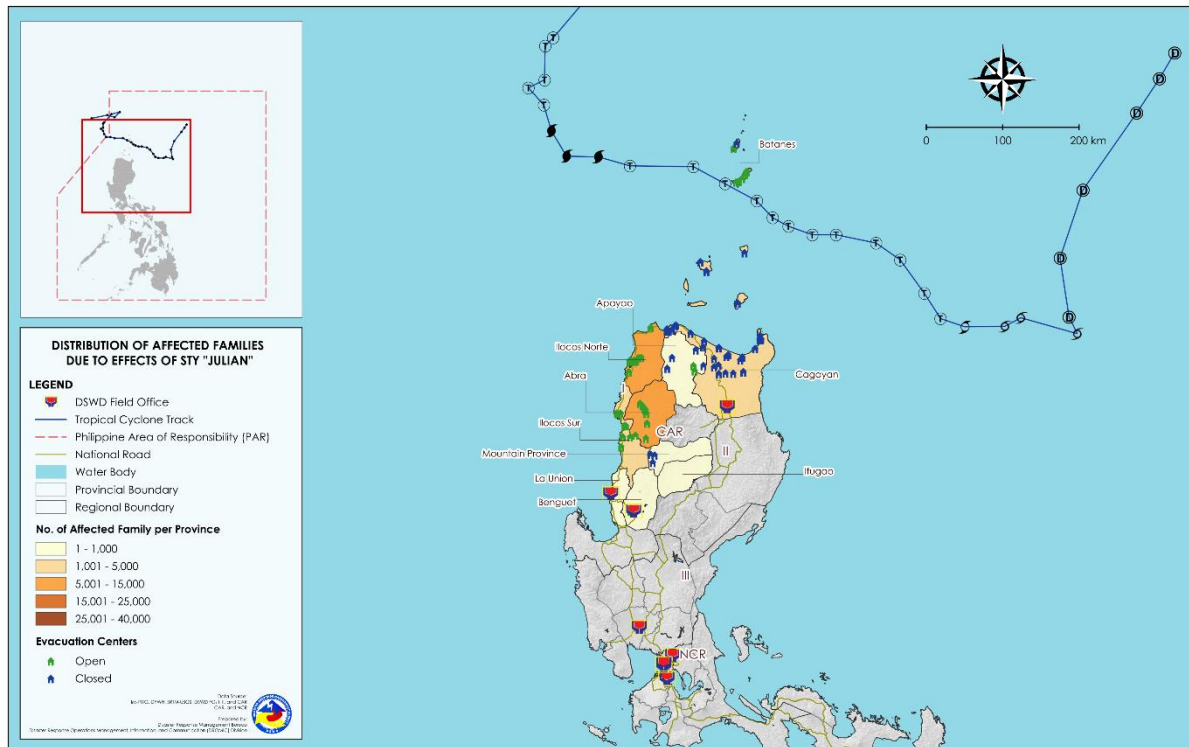
- “Julian” is forecast to make landfall over southwestern Taiwan this morning or afternoon after entering the northwestern boundary of the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR). Due to a combination of incoming northeasterly wind flow over the East China Sea and Taiwan Strait and lower ocean heat content in its vicinity (which is related to upwelling of cooler waters caused by its slow movement for nearly two days), “Julian” is forecast to continue weakening. Despite its re-entry in the PAR region, no direct effect is anticipated over the country except for Batanes, which is relatively close to Taiwan.
- After landfall, “Julian” is forecast to move erratically over Taiwan while rapidly weakening due to land interaction. This tropical cyclone is forecast to become a remnant low over Taiwan tomorrow (4 October).

The center of the eye of Typhoon “Julian” was estimated based on all available data at 265 km Northwest of Itbayat, Batanes (OUTSIDE PAR) (22.2°N, 119.8°E) moving Northeastward slowly with maximum sustained winds of 140 km/h near the center and gustiness of up to 170 km/h.

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **62,790 families** or **224,175 persons** are affected in **771 barangays** in **Regions I, II, and CAR** (see Annex A).



III. Status of Displaced Population

a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are **86 families** or **260 persons** currently taking temporary shelter in **17 evacuation centers** in **Regions II** and **CAR** (see Annex B).

b. Outside Evacuation Center

There are **293 families** or **1,168 persons** temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex E).

c. Total Displaced Population

There are **379 families** or **1,428 persons** displaced in **Regions II** and **CAR** (see Annex F).

IV. Damaged Houses

A total of **1,843 houses** were damaged; of which, **202** are **totally damaged** and **1,641** are **partially damaged** in **Region I, II, and CAR** (see Annex G).

V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of **₱22,002,387.05** worth of assistance was provided to the affected families; of which, **₱14,219,660.51** from **DSWD**, **₱4,735,373.27** from the **Local Government Units (LGUs)**, **₱2,960,933.27** from **Non-Governmental Organizations (NGOs)**, and **₱86,420.00** from **other Partners** (see Annex H).
