
I. Situation Overview

Issued on 03 October 2024 at 5PM, "Julian" has made landfall over Southern Taiwan.

HAZARD AFFECTING COASTAL WATERS

24-Hour Sea Condition Outlook

Under the influence of Typhoon "Julian", a Gale Warning is hoisted over the northern seaboard of Northern Luzon.



Moderate or rough seas over the following coastal waters:

- Up to 4.0 m over the seaboards of Batanes, Babuyan Islands, and Ilocos Norte
- Up to 3.5 m over the remaining seaboards of Ilocos Region
- Up to 3.0 m over the northern seaboard of Mainland Cagayan, Zambales, and Bataan
- Up to 2.5 m over the western seaboard of Lubang Island, the western seaboard of Calamian Islands, and the seaboard of Kalayaan Islands

Mariners of small seacrafts, including all types of motorbancas, are advised not to venture out to sea under these conditions, especially if inexperienced or operating illequipped vessels

TRACK AND INTENSITY OUTLOOK

• Due to a combination of incoming northeasterly wind flow over the East China Sea and Taiwan Strait, lower ocean heat content in its vicinity (which is related to upwelling of cooler waters caused by its slow movement for nearly three days), and the interaction with the rugged terrain of Taiwan, "Julian" is forecast to continue weakening. Despite its re-entry in the PAR region, no direct effect is anticipated over the country. This tropical cyclone is forecast to become a remnant low over Taiwan tomorrow (4 October).

The center of the eye of Typhoon "Julian" was estimated based on all available data at 255 km North Northwest of Itbayat, Batanes (22.7 °N, 120.5 °E) moving East








Northeastward at 10km/h with maximum sustained winds of 120 km/h near the center and gustiness of up to 200 km/h.

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **63,560 families** or **227,025 persons** are affected in **777 barangays** in **Regions I, II,** and **CAR** (see Annex A).



III. Status of Displaced Population

a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are 148 families or 429 persons currently taking temporary shelter in 19 evacuation centers in Regions II and CAR (see Annex B).

b. Outside Evacuation Center

There are 434 families or 1,466 persons temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex E).

c. Total Displaced Population

There are **582 families** or **1,895 persons** displaced in **Regions II** and **CAR** (see Annex F).

IV. Damaged Houses

A total of 1,846 houses were damaged; of which, 202 are totally damaged and 1,644 are partially damaged in Region I, II, and CAR (see Annex G).







V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of ₱24,763,743.85 worth of assistance was provided to the affected families; of which, ₱16,795,897.31 from DSWD, ₱4,963,973.27 from the Local Government Units (LGUs), ₱2,960,933.27 from Non-Governmental Organizations (NGOs), and ₱42,940.00 from other Partners (see Annex H).


