

DSWD DROMIC Report on the Flash Flood Incident in Tantangan, South Cotabato

18 October 2024, 6AM

I. Situation Overview

On 09 June 2022, the municipality of Tantangan, South Cotabato experienced a flash flood incident due to heavy rains caused by the Intertropical Convergence Zone (ITCZ) or localized thunderstorms.
