

DSWD DROMIC Report #14 on Typhoon “Nika”, Super Typhoon "Ofel", and Super Typhoon “Pepito” as of 17 November 2024, 6PM


I. Situation Overview

Issued on 17 November 2024 at 5:00 PM, Super Typhoon “Pepito” has made its second landfall in the vicinity of Dipaculao, Aurora and is now over and is now over Quirino Province.

HAZARDS AFFECTING LAND AREAS

Heavy Rainfall Outlook

Refer to Weather Advisory No. 53 issued at 5:00 PM today for the heavy rainfall outlook associated with “PEPITO”.



Severe Winds

The wind signals warn the public of the general wind threat over an area due to the tropical cyclone. Local winds may be slightly stronger/enhanced in coastal and upland/mountainous areas exposed to winds. Winds are less strong in areas sheltered from the prevailing wind direction.

- Extreme impacts from typhoon-force winds are possible within any of the areas under Wind Signal No. 5.
- Significant to severe impacts from typhoon-force winds are possible within any of the areas under Wind Signal No. 4.
- Moderate to significant impacts from storm-force winds are possible within any of the areas under Wind Signal No. 3.
- Minor to moderate impacts from gale-force winds are possible within any of the areas under Wind Signal No. 2.
- Minimal to minor impacts from strong winds are possible within any of the areas under Wind Signal No. 1.

Coastal Inundation

There is a high risk of life-threatening storm surge with peak surge heights exceeding 3.0 m in the next 48 hours over the low-lying or exposed coastal localities of Ilocos Region (western coast), southeastern mainland Cagayan, Isabela, Central Luzon,

Metro Manila, Cavite, southeastern Batangas, and Quezon. Refer to Storm Surge Warning No. 11 issued at 2:00 PM today for the details.

A Gale Warning is hoisted over the eastern seaboard of Luzon and the western seaboards of Northern and Central Luzon. Refer to Gale Warning No. 15 issued at 5:00 PM today for the details.

TRACK AND INTENSITY OUTLOOK


- After making landfall in the vicinity of Dipaculao, Aurora at 3:20 PM today, PEPITO will cross the northern portion of Central Luzon and the southern portion of Northern Luzon via the upland regions of the Sierra Madre, Caraballo, and Cordillera Central between this afternoon and evening. PEPITO is forecast to exit the landmass of Luzon tonight or tomorrow early morning (18 November). During this period, PEPITO will significantly weaken due to land interaction.
- Over the West Philippine Sea, PEPITO will continue moving generally west northwestward tomorrow. It may exit the PAR region tomorrow morning or noon. Outside the PAR region, the tropical cyclone will turn more westward or west southwestward on Tuesday (19 November) under the influence of an incoming northeasterly wind surge. Further weakening will also occur as PEPITO moves over the West Philippine Sea due to the same surge creating unfavorable environment.
- It must be emphasized that heavy rainfall, severe winds, and storm surge may still be experienced in localities outside the landfall point and the forecast confidence cone. Refer to “Other Hazards affecting Land Areas” for more details. Furthermore, the track may still shift within the limit of the forecast confidence cone.

The center of the eye was estimated based on all available data including from Baler Weather Radar in the vicinity of Nagtipunan, Quirino (16.1°N , 121.5°E) moving Moving Northwestward at 25 km/h with a maximum sustained winds of 185 km/h near the center and gustiness of up to 305 km/h.

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **465,680 families** or **1,751,148 persons** are affected in **3,330 barangays** in **Regions I, II, III, MIMAROPA, V, VIII, and CAR** (see Annex A).



III. Status of Displaced Population

a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are **85,708 families** or **385,443 persons** currently taking temporary shelter in **1,781 evacuation centers** in **Regions II, III, MIMAROPA, V, VIII, and CAR** (see Annex B).

b. Outside Evacuation Center

There are **61,643 families** or **222,522 persons** temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex E).

c. Total Displaced Population

There are **147,351 families** or **607,965 persons** still displaced in **Regions II, III, MIMAROPA, V, VIII, and CAR** (see Annex F).

IV. Damaged Houses

A total of **7,909 houses** were damaged; of which, **438** are **totally damaged** and **7,471** are partially damaged in **Regions I, II, III, and CAR** (see Annex G).

V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of **₱34,526,504.44** worth of assistance was provided to the affected families composed of **₱31,270,161.33** from **DSWD**, **₱2,913,183.11** from the **Local**

Government Unit (LGUs), ₱338,600.00 Non-Government Organizations (NGOs), and ₱4,500.00 from other Partners (see Annex H).
