

DSWD DROMIC Report #15 on Typhoon “Nika”, Super Typhoon “Ofel”, and Super Typhoon “Pepito” as of 18 November 2024, 6AM

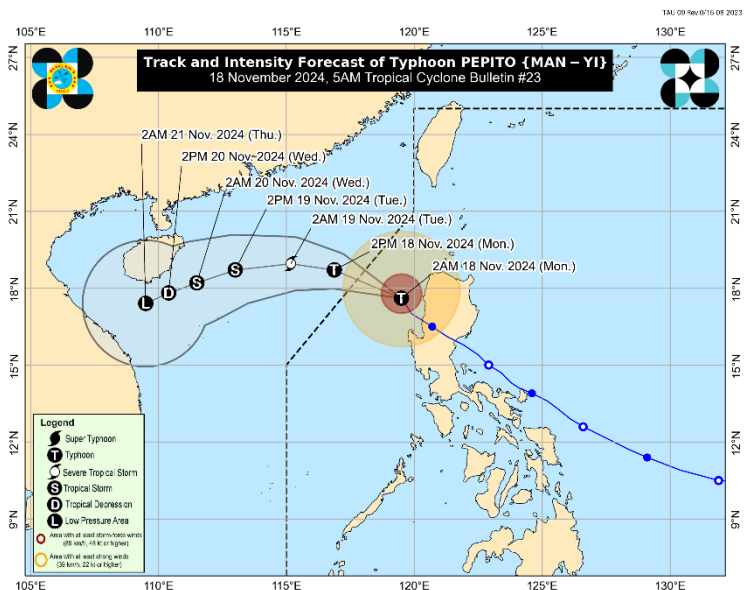
I. Situation Overview

Issued on 18 November 2024 at 5:00 AM, Super Typhoon “Pepito” continues to move northwestward over the West Philippine Sea.

HAZARDS AFFECTING LAND AREAS

Heavy Rainfall Outlook

Refer to Weather Advisory No. 57 issued at 5:00 AM today for the heavy rainfall outlook associated with “Pepito”.



Severe Winds

The wind signals warn the public of the general wind threat over an area due to the tropical cyclone. Local winds may be slightly stronger/enhanced in coastal and upland/mountainous areas exposed to winds. Winds are less strong in areas sheltered from the prevailing wind direction.

- Moderate to significant impacts from storm-force winds are possible within any of the areas under Wind Signal No. 3.
- Minor to moderate impacts from gale-force winds are possible within any of the areas under Wind Signal No. 2.
- Minimal to minor impacts from strong winds are possible within any of the areas under Wind Signal No. 1.

Coastal Inundation

There is a moderate to high risk of storm surge that may occur in the next 48 hours in the low-lying or exposed coastal localities of Ilocos Region, Isabela, and Central Luzon.

HAZARDS AFFECTING COASTAL WATERS

A Gale Warning is hoisted over the seaboard of Northern Luzon and the western seaboard of Central Luzon.

24-Hour Sea Condition Outlook

Note: These are forecast sea condition over the coastal waters and not related to storm surge heights or inundation.

Up to very rough over the following coastal waters:

- Up to 5.0 m: The seaboards of Batanes
- Up to 4.5 m: The western seaboard of Ilocos Norte; the seaboards of Ilocos Sur and Isabela; the eastern seaboard of mainland Cagayan
- Sea travel is risky for all types or tonnage of vessels. All mariners must remain in port or, if underway, seek shelter or safe harbor as soon as possible until winds and waves subside.

Up to rough seas over the following coastal waters:

- Up to 4.0 m: The seaboards of Babuyan Islands; the remaining seaboard of mainland Cagayan
- Up to 3.5 m: The seaboards of La Union; the western seaboard of Pangasinan
- Up to 3.0 m: The seaboard of Aurora and northern Zambales
- Mariners of small seacrafts, including all types of motorbancas, are advised not to venture out to sea under these conditions, especially if inexperienced or operating ill-equipped vessels

Up to moderate seas over the following coastal waters:

- Up to 2.5 m: The seaboard of northern Quezon; the northern and eastern seaboard of Polillo Islands
- Up to 2.0 m: The seaboards of Catanduanes, Bataan, and Lubang Islands; the eastern seaboards of Albay and Sorsogon, the northern and eastern seaboards of Camarines Norte, Camarines Sur, and Northern Samar; the remaining seaboard of Zambales
- Mariners of motorbancas and similarly-sized vessels are advised to take precautionary measures while venturing out to sea and, if possible, avoid navigation under these conditions.

TRACK AND INTENSITY OUTLOOK

- “Pepito” will continue moving northwestward to west northwestward today over the West Philippine Sea until it exits the PAR region this morning or noon. Outside the PAR region, the tropical cyclone will turn more westward or west southwestward tomorrow (19 November) under the influence of an incoming northeasterly wind surge.
- “Pepito” moves over the West Philippine Sea due to the same surge creating unfavorable environment. This tropical cyclone may become a remnant low by Wednesday (20 November) late evening or Thursday (21 November) early morning over the coast of southern China.

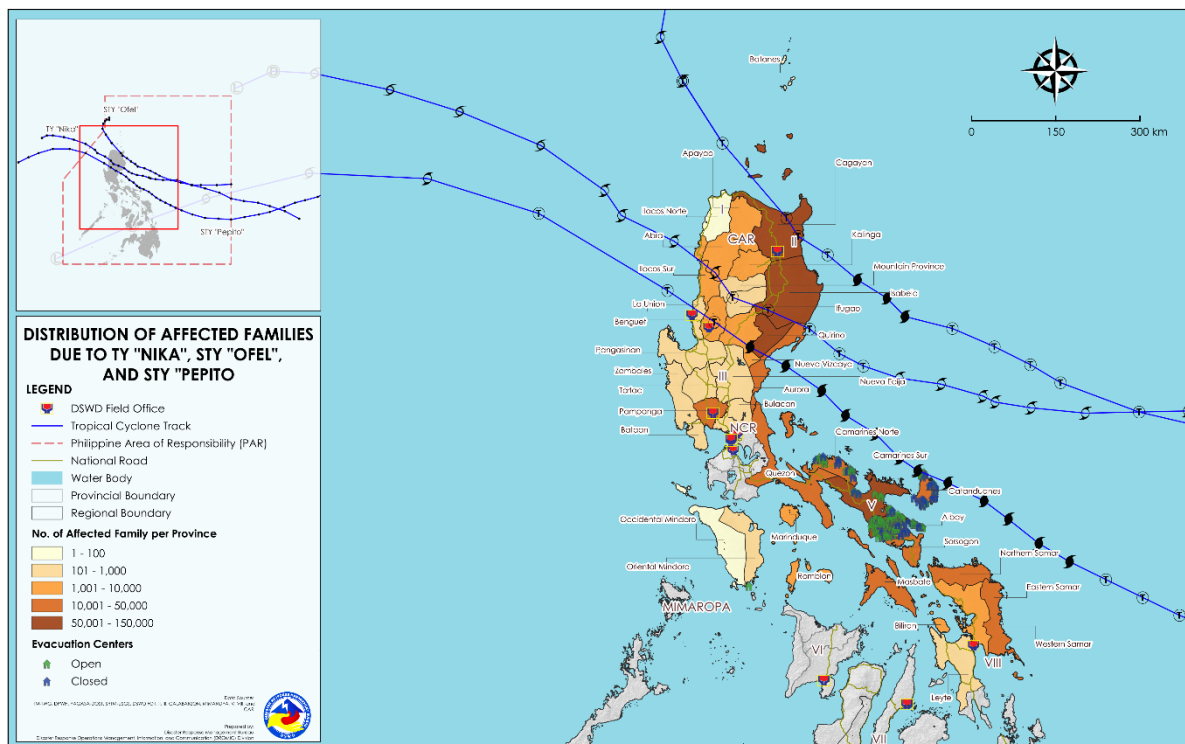
The center of the eye of “Pepito” was estimated based on all available data 145 km West of Sinit, Ilocos Sur (17.8 °N, 119.1 °E) while moving Northeastward at 30 km/h

with a maximum sustained winds of 130 km/h near the center and gustiness of up to 160 km/h.

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **634,476 families** or **2,341,490 persons** are affected in **4,603 barangays** in **Regions I, II, III, CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, V, VIII, and CAR** (see Annex A).



III. Status of Displaced Population

a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are **111,799 families** or **458,494 persons** currently taking temporary shelter in **3,344 evacuation centers** in **Regions I, II, III, CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, V, VIII, and CAR** (see Annex B).

b. Outside Evacuation Center

There are **56,162 families** or **197,151 persons** temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex E).

c. Total Displaced Population

There are **167,961 families** or **655,645 persons** still displaced in in **Regions I, II, III, CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, V, VIII, and CAR** (see Annex F).

IV. Damaged Houses

A total of **9,623 houses** were damaged; of which, **504** are **totally damaged** and **9,119** are partially damaged in **Regions I, II, III, and CAR** (see Annex G).

V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of **₱77,278,012.74** worth of assistance was provided to the affected families composed of **₱70,788,219.63** from **DSWD**, **₱6,146,633.11** from the **Local Government Unit (LGUs)**, **₱338,600.00** from **Non-Government Organizations (NGOs)**, and **₱4,500.00** from **other Partners** (see Annex H).
