

DSWD DROMIC Report #17 on Typhoon “Nika”, Super Typhoon “Ofel”, and Super Typhoon “Pepito” as of 19 November 2024, 6AM

I. Situation Overview

Issued on 18 November 2024 at 5:00 PM, Super Typhoon “Pepito” is now outside the Philippine Area of Responsibility.


HAZARDS AFFECTING LAND AREAS

Heavy Rainfall Outlook

The effect of Super Typhoon “Pepito” over the country has weakened.

Severe Winds

The surge of the northeasterly wind flow enhanced by PEPITO will bring strong to gale-force gusts over the following areas especially in coastal and upland areas exposed to winds.



HAZARDS AFFECTING COASTAL WATERS

A Gale Warning is hoisted over the northern seaboard of Northern Luzon.

24-Hour Sea Condition Outlook

Note: These are forecast sea condition over the coastal waters and not related to storm surge heights or inundation.

Up to very rough over the following coastal waters:

- Up to 5.0 m: The seaboard of Batanes
- Up to 4.5 m: The seaboards of Ilocos Norte; the western seaboard of Babuyan Islands
- Sea travel is risky for all types or tonnage of vessels. All mariners must remain in port or, if underway, seek shelter or safe harbor as soon as possible until winds and waves subside.

Up to rough seas over the following coastal waters:

- Up to 3.5 m: The remaining seaboard of Babuyan Islands
- Up to 3.0 m: The eastern seaboard of mainland Cagayan; the remaining seaboard of Ilocos Region.
- Mariners of small seacrafts, including all types of motorbancas, are advised not to venture out to sea under these conditions, especially if inexperienced or operating ill-equipped vessels.

Up to moderate seas over the following coastal waters:

- Up to 2.5 m: The remaining seaboard of Cagayan Valley; the seaboard of northern Aurora, northern Zambales and Kalayaan Islands.
- Up to 2.0 m: The remaining seabards of Aurora and Zambales; the northern and eastern seabards of Pollilo Islands; the seabards of Camarines Norte and Zamboanga del Sur; the northern seaboard of Camarines Sur, the northern, eastern, and southern seabards of Catanduanes; the eastern seabards of Albay, Sorsogon, Eastern Samar, Dinagat Islands, Surigao del Sur, Davao Oriental, and Davao Occidental; the southern seabards of Negros Oriental and Occidental Mindoro; the eastern and western seabards of Calamian Islands; the northern seaboard of Cuyo Islands; the western seabards of Bataan, Lubang Islands, Caluya Islands, and mainland Palawan.
- Mariners of motorbancas and similarly-sized vessels are advised to take precautionary measures while venturing out to sea and, if possible, avoid navigation under these conditions.

TRACK AND INTENSITY OUTLOOK


- Outside the PAR region, the tropical cyclone will turn more westward or west southwestward under the influence of an incoming northeasterly wind surge.
- “PEPITO” will continue to weaken as it moves over the West Philippine Sea due to the incoming northeasterly wind surge creating unfavorable environment. This tropical cyclone may become a remnant low on Wednesday (20 November).

The center of the eye of “Pepito” was estimated based on all available data at 405 km West Northwest of Sinait, Ilocos Sur (18.7 °N, 116.7 °E) while moving West Northeastward at 20 km/h with a maximum sustained winds of 110 km/h near the center and gustiness of up to 135 km/h.

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **850,696 families** or **3,117,555 persons** are affected in **6,251 barangays** in **Regions I, II, III, CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, V, VIII, and CAR** (see Annex A).



III. Status of Displaced Population

a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are **115,963 families** or **468,698 persons** currently taking temporary shelter in **3,267 evacuation centers** in **Regions I, II, III, CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, V, VIII, and CAR** (see Annex B).

b. Outside Evacuation Center

There are **52,773 families** or **182,793 persons** temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex E).

c. Total Displaced Population

There are **168,736 families** or **651,491 persons** still displaced in **Regions I, II, III, CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, V, VIII, and CAR** (see Annex F).

IV. Damaged Houses

A total of **9,797 houses** were damaged; of which, **518** are **totally damaged** and **9,279** are partially damaged in **Regions I, II, III, V, and CAR** (see Annex G).

V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of **₱134,868,426.18** worth of assistance was provided to the affected families; of which, **₱125,837,413.17** from **DSWD**, **₱8,504,144.93** from the **Local Government Units (LGUs)**, **₱469,188.08** from **Non-Government Organizations (NGOs)**, and **₱57,680.00** from **other Partners** (see Annex H).
