

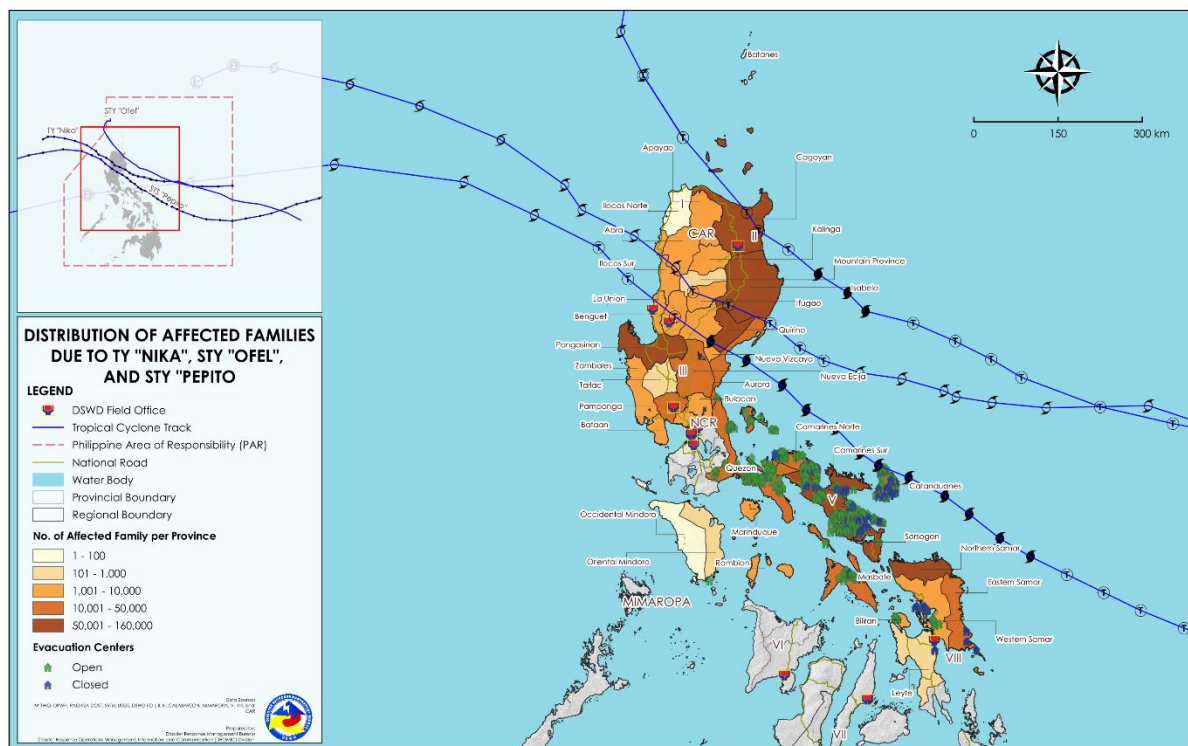
DSWD DROMIC Report #18 on Typhoon “Nika”, Super Typhoon “Ofel”, and Super Typhoon “Pepito” as of 19 November 2024, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

On 18 November 2024, “Pepito” exited the Philippine Area of Responsibility.

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **883,246 families** or **3,240,592 persons** are affected in **6,383 barangays** in **Regions I, II, III, CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, V, VIII, and CAR** (see Annex A).



III. Status of Displaced Population

a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are **115,590 families** or **467,050 persons** currently taking temporary shelter in **3,240 evacuation centers** in **Regions I, II, III, CALABARZON, V, VIII, and CAR** (see Annex B).

b. Outside Evacuation Center

There are **55,446 families** or **192,698 persons** temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex E).

c. Total Displaced Population

There are **171,036 families** or **659,748 persons** still displaced in in **Regions I, II, III, CALABARZON, V, VIII, and CAR** (see Annex F).

IV. Damaged Houses

A total of **10,864 houses** were damaged; of which, **639** are **totally damaged** and **10,225** are partially damaged in **Regions I, II, III, V, and CAR** (see Annex G).

V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of **₱143,750,091.45** worth of assistance was provided to the affected families; of which, **₱133,417,353.44** from **DSWD**, **₱9,805,869.93** from the **Local Government Units (LGUs)**, **₱469,188.08** from **Non-Government Organizations (NGOs)**, and **₱57,680.00** from **other Partners** (see Annex H).
