

# DSWD DROMIC Report #19 on Typhoon “Nika”, Super Typhoon “Ofel”, and Super Typhoon “Pepito” as of 20 November 2024, 6AM

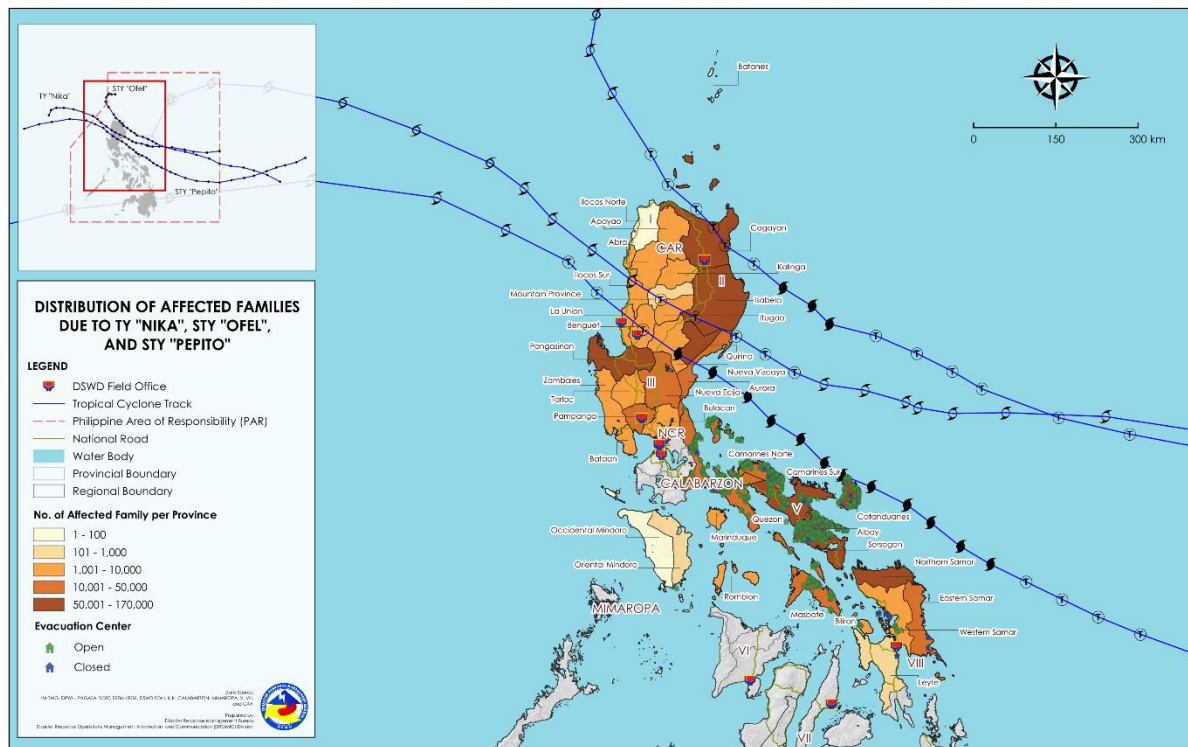
## I. Situation Overview

On 18 November 2024, “Pepito” exited the Philippine Area of Responsibility.

## II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **1,023,856 families** or **3,788,757 persons** are affected in **6,857 barangays** in **Regions I, II, III, CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, V, VIII, and CAR** (see Annex A).



## III. Status of Displaced Population

### a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are **91,299 families** or **362,526 persons** currently taking temporary shelter in **2,439 evacuation centers** in **Regions I, II, III, CALABARZON, V, VIII, and CAR** (see Annex B).

### b. Outside Evacuation Center

There are **48,949 families** or **172,047 persons** temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex E).

### c. Total Displaced Population

There are **140,248 families** or **534,573 persons** still displaced in in **Regions I, II, III, CALABARZON, V, VIII, and CAR** (see Annex F).

## IV. Damaged Houses

A total of **41,875 houses** were damaged; of which, **6,598** are **totally damaged** and **35,277** are partially damaged in **Regions I, II, III, V, and CAR** (see Annex G).

## V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of **₱167,409,387.74** worth of assistance was provided to the affected families; of which, **₱156,059,441.23** from **DSWD**, **₱10,744,400.93** from the **Local Government Units (LGUs)**, **₱547,865.58** from **Non-Government Organizations (NGOs)**, and **₱57,680.00** from **other Partners** (see Annex H).
