

## DSWD DROMIC Report #20 on Typhoon “Nika”, Super Typhoon “Ofel”, and Super Typhoon “Pepito” as of 20 November 2024, 6PM


### I. Situation Overview

On 18 November 2024, “Pepito” exited the Philippine Area of Responsibility.

### II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **1,036,760 families** or **3,833,536 persons** are affected in **6,965 barangays** in **Regions I, II, III, CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, V, VIII, and CAR** (see Annex A).



### III. Status of Displaced Population

#### a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are **88,750 families** or **354,353 persons** currently taking temporary shelter in **2,283 evacuation centers** in **Regions I, II, III, CALABARZON, V, VIII, and CAR** (see Annex B).

#### b. Outside Evacuation Center

There are **42,249 families** or **145,542 persons** temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex E).

### c. Total Displaced Population

There are **130,999 families** or **499,895 persons** still displaced in **Regions I, II, III, CALABARZON, V, VIII, and CAR** (see Annex F).

## IV. Damaged Houses

A total of **42,921 houses** were damaged; of which, **6,669** are **totally damaged** and **36,252** are partially damaged in **Regions I, II, III, V, and CAR** (see Annex G).

## V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of **₱218,655,482.00** worth of assistance was provided to the affected families; of which, **₱206,994,097.49** from **DSWD**, **₱11,055,838.93** from the **Local Government Units (LGUs)**, **₱547,865.58** from **Non-Government Organizations (NGOs)**, and **₱57,680.00** from **other Partners** (see Annex H).
