
I. Situation Overview

On 18 November 2024, “Pepito” exited the Philippine Area of Responsibility.

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **1,095,676 families** or **4,047,380 persons** are affected in **7,234 barangays** in **Regions I, II, III, CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, V, VIII, and CAR** (see Annex A).



III. Status of Displaced Population

a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are **50,907 families** or **182,669 persons** currently taking temporary shelter in **1,268 evacuation centers** in **Regions I, II, III, CALABARZON, V, VIII, and CAR** (see Annex B).

b. Outside Evacuation Center

There are **35,047 families** or **122,175 persons** temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex E).

c. Total Displaced Population

There are **85,954 families** or **304,844 persons** still displaced in in **Regions I, II, III, CALABARZON, V, VIII,** and **CAR** (see Annex F).

IV. Damaged Houses

A total of **52,122 houses** were damaged; of which, **8,812** are **totally damaged** and **43,310** are partially damaged in **Regions I, II, III, CALABARZON, V,** and **CAR** (see Annex G).

V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of **₱275,659,364.14** worth of assistance was provided to the affected families; of which, **₱256,507,934.03** from **DSWD**, **₱18,400,984.53** from the **Local Government Units (LGUs)**, **₱692,765.58** from **Non-Government Organizations (NGOs)**, and **₱57,680.00** from **other Partners** (see Annex H).
