

DSWD DROMIC Report #24 on Severe Tropical Storm “Kristine” and Super Typhoon “Leon” as of 02 November 2024, 6AM

I. Situation Overview

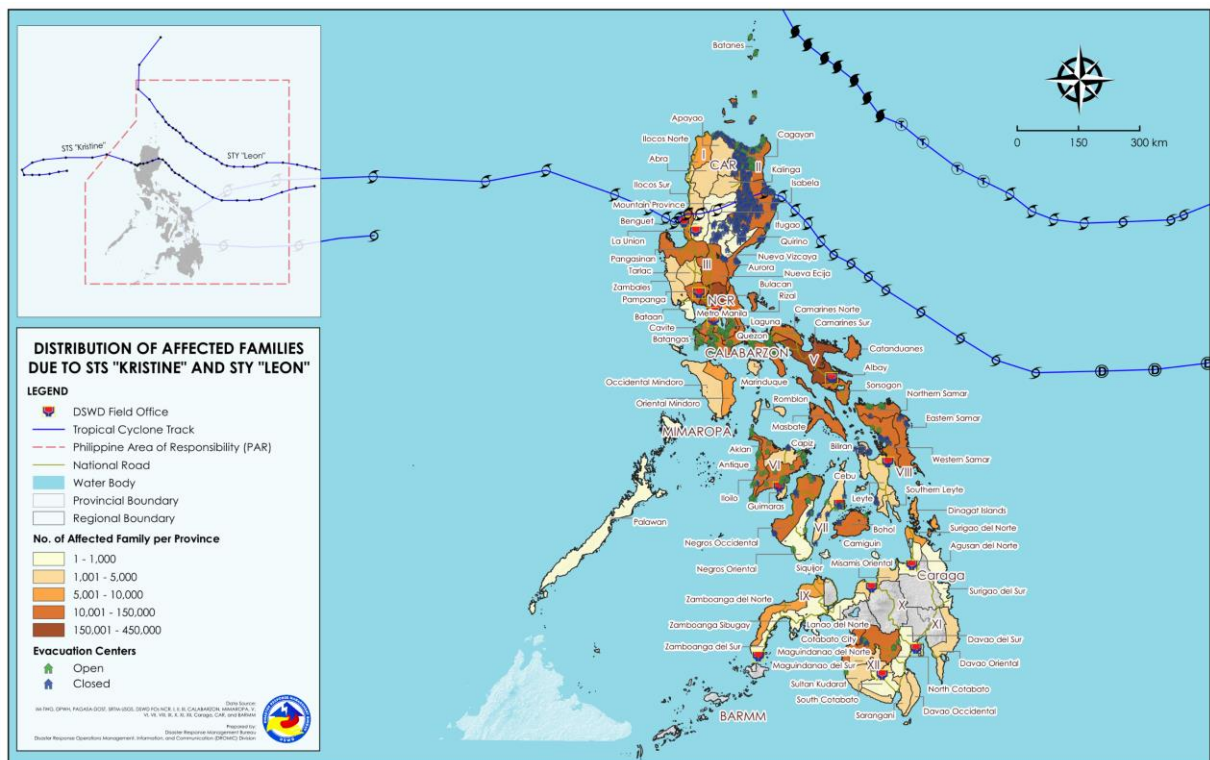
On 25 October 2024, Severe Tropical Storm “Kristine” exited the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR).

On 01 November 2024, Super Typhoon “Leon” has weakened into severe tropical storm and exited the PAR.

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **2,178,883 families** or **8,463,377 persons** are affected in **12,006 barangays** in **Regions NCR, I, II, III, CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, V, VI, VII, VIII, IX, X, XI, XII, Caraga, CAR, and BARMM** (see Annex A).



III. Status of Displaced Population

a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are **57,977 families** or **225,428 persons** currently taking temporary shelter in **1,374 evacuation centers** in **Regions NCR, II, III, CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, V, VI, VII, VIII, IX, XII, and Caraga** (see Annex B).

b. Outside Evacuation Center

There are **99,919 families** or **475,389 persons** temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex E).

c. Total Displaced Population

There are **157,896 families** or **700,817 persons** still displaced in **Regions NCR, I, II, III, CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, V, VI, VII, VIII, IX, X, XII, Caraga, and CAR** (see Annex F).

IV. Damaged Houses

A total of **116,014 houses** were damaged; of which **25,630** are **totally damaged** and **90,384** are **partially damaged** in **Regions I, II, III, CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, V, VI, VII, VIII, IX, X, XI, XII, Caraga, and CAR** (see Annex G).

V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of **₱783,131,279.15** worth of assistance was provided to the affected families composed of **₱744,501,252.96** from **DSWD**, **₱36,314,483.47** from the **Local Government Units (LGUs)**, **₱2,010,755.00** from the **Non-Governmental Organizations (NGOs)**, and **₱304,787.72** from **other Partners** (see Annex H).
