

DSWD DROMIC Report #1 on Tropical Depression "Querubin"

as of 20 December 2024, 6AM

I. Situation Overview

On 19 December 2024 at 4:00 AM, the Low Pressure Area (LPA) (formerly "Querubin") was estimated based on all available data at 245 km East of Surigao City, Surigao del Norte (9.8°N, 127.7°E). Cloudy skies with scattered rains and thunderstorms may have brought possible flash floods or landslides due to moderate to heavy with at times in the rest of Visayas and Mindanao.

On the same day, continuous heavy rainfall was experienced in different parts of Oroquieta City in Misamis Occidental which caused flooding in several barangays due to trough of LPA.

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **86 families** or **549 persons** are affected in **two (2) barangays** in **Oroquieta City, Misamis Occidental** (see Annex A).

There are **35 families** or **141 persons** currently taking temporary shelter at the **Brgy. Hall** in **Oroquieta City, Misamis Occidental** (see Annex B).

1. Standby Funds

- ₱32.45 million Quick Response Fund (QRF) at the DSWD Central Office.
- ₱3 million available at DSWD FO X.
- ₱44 million available in other DSWD FOs which may support the relief needs of the families affected by Tropical Depression "Querubin" through inter-FO augmentation.



2. Prepositioned FFPs and Other Relief Items
