

DSWD DROMIC Report #1 on the Effects of Easterlies in Ozamis City, Misamis Occidental

as of 21 December 2024, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

On 22 November 2024, Ozamis City, Misamis Occidental experienced heavy rain, strong winds and severe weather condition due to Easterlies that caused damages to houses in several barangays in the area.

A total of **seven (7) families** or **35 persons** are affected in **five (5) barangays** in **Ozamis City, Misamis Occidental** (see Annex A).

III. Damaged Houses

A total of **seven (7) houses** were **partially damaged** in **Ozamis City, Misamis Occidental** (see Annex B).

IV. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of **₱104,496.00** worth of assistance was provided to the affected families; of which, **₱55,426.00** from **DSWD** and **₱49,070.00** from the **Local Government Unit (LGU)** (see Annex C).
