

# DSWD DROMIC Report #1 on the Effects of Shear Line

as of 02 December 2024, 6PM

## I. Situation Overview

On 01 December 2024 at 4AM, cloudy skies with scattered rains and thunderstorms caused by Shear Line might have caused possible flash floods or landslides to moderate to heavy rains in Metro Manila, CALABARZON, Bicol Region, Eastern Visayas, Western Visayas, Bulacan, Oriental Mindoro, Marinduque, Romblon, Negros Occidental, and Cebu.

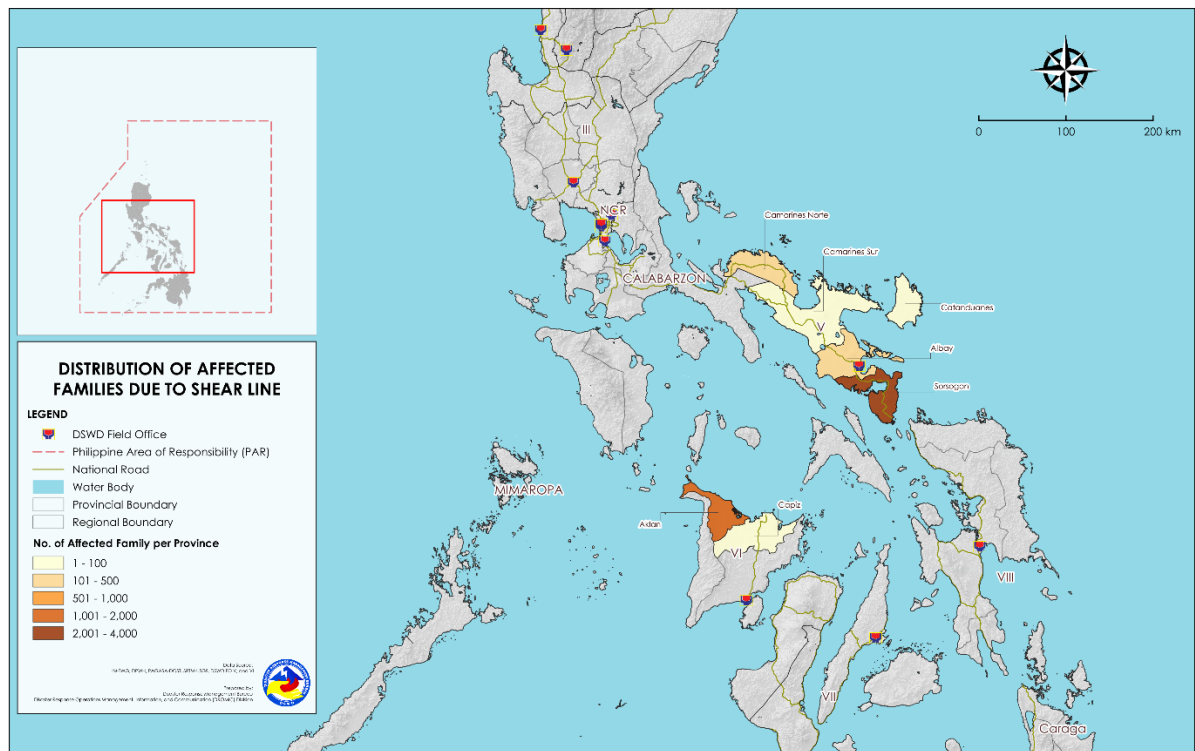
On the same day, several municipalities in the Bicol Region experienced landslides and localized floods and caused by the continuous and intense rainfall.

Meanwhile, the heavy rains caused landslides and flooding in low-lying areas in Capiz.

## II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **4,859 families** or **21,995 persons** are affected in **104 barangays** in **Regions V and VI** (see Annex A).



### III. Status of Displaced Population

#### a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are **657 families** or **2,354 persons** currently taking temporary shelter in **44 evacuation centers** in **Regions V** and **VI** (see Annex B).

#### b. Outside Evacuation Center

There are **311 families** or **1,482 persons** temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex D).

#### c. Total Displaced Population

There are **968 families** or **3,836 persons** still displaced in **Regions V** and **VI** (see Annex E).

### IV. Damaged Houses

A total of **11 houses** were damaged; of which, **one (1)** is **totally damaged** and **ten** are **partially damaged** in **Region V** (see Annex F).

#### 1. Standby Funds

- ₱53.44 million Quick Response Fund (QRF) at the DSWD Central Office.
- ₱6 million available at DSWD FO V and VI.
- ₱40.62 million available in other DSWD FOs which may support the relief needs of the families affected by the Effects of Shear Line.

#### 2. Prepositioned FFPs and Other Relief Items
