

DSWD DROMIC Report #10 on Kanlaon Volcano Eruption


I. Situation Overview

- As of 14 December 2024, Kanlaon Volcano remains under Alert Level 3.
- On 09 December 2024 at 3:03 PM, Alert Level 3 was raised from Alert Level 2 over the Kanlaon Volcano after an explosive eruption that occurred at the summit vent. The eruption produced a voluminous plume that rapidly rose to 3,000 meters above the vent and drifted west-southwest. Pyroclastic density currents (PDCs) descended the slopes on the general southeastern edifice based on IP and thermal camera monitors.
- The raising of the Alert Level of Kanlaon Volcano from Alert Level 2 (increasing unrest) to Alert Level 3 (magmatic unrest) means that a magmatic eruption has begun and may progress to further explosive eruptions. All local government units are advised to evacuate the 6-km radius from the summit of the volcano and must be prepared for additional evacuation if activity warrants.

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **10,224 families** or **42,249 persons** are affected in **26 barangays** in **Regions VI** and **VII** (see sAnnex A).





III. Status of Displaced Population

a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are **4,761 families** or **15,902 persons** currently taking temporary shelter in **29 evacuation centers** in **Regions VI** and **VII** (see Annex B).

b. Outside Evacuation Center

There are **1,152 families** or **4,064 persons** temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex E).

c. Total Displaced Population

There are **5,913 families** or **19,966 persons** still displaced in **Regions VI** and **VII** (see Annex F).

IV. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of ₱16,619,426.71 worth of assistance was provided to the affected families; of which, ₱15,079,128.20 from DSWD, ₱1,040,298.51 from the Local Government Units (LGUs), and ₱500,000.00 from Non-Government Organizations (NGOs) (see Annex G).
