

# DSWD DROMIC Report #12 on Kanlaon Volcano Eruption

as of 15 December 2024, 6PM

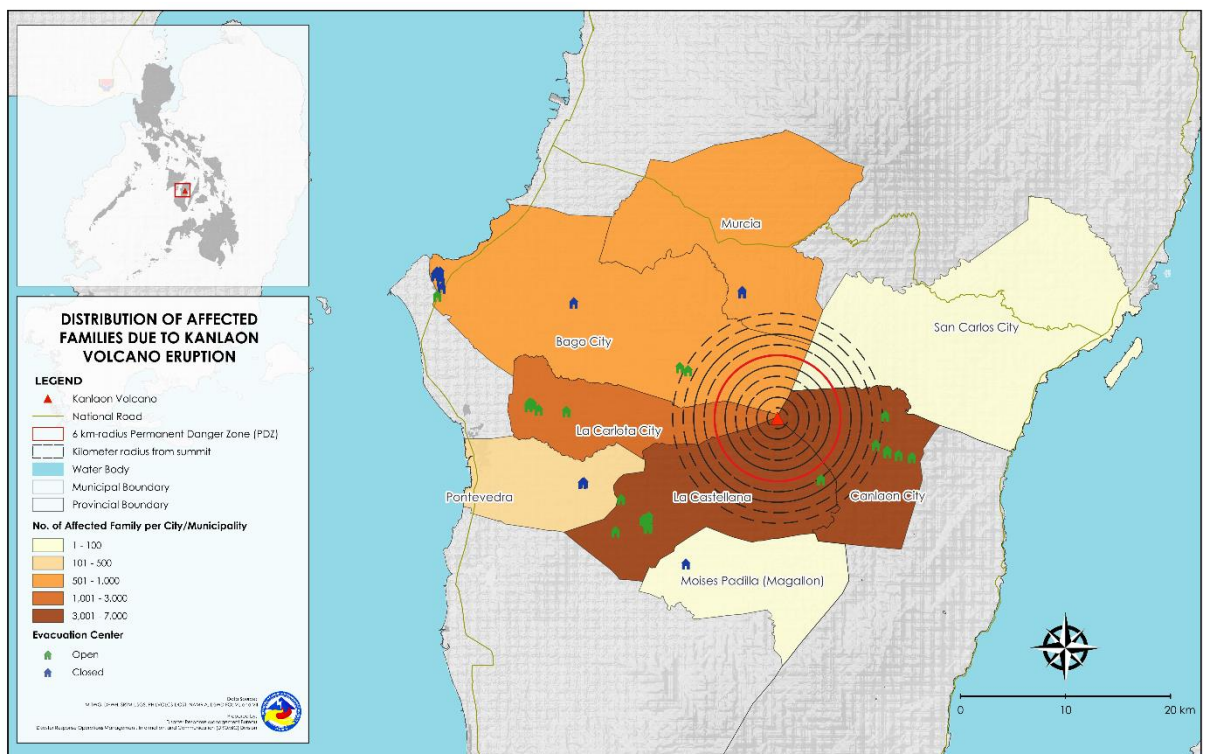
## I. Situation Overview

- As of **15 December 2024**, Kanlaon Volcano remains under **Alert Level 3**.
- On 09 December 2024 at 3:03 PM, Alert Level 3 was raised from Alert Level 2 over the Kanlaon Volcano after an explosive eruption that occurred at the summit vent. The eruption produced a voluminous plume that rapidly rose to 3,000 meters above the vent and drifted west-southwest. Pyroclastic density currents (PDCs) descended the slopes on the general southeastern edifice based on IP and thermal camera monitors.
- The raising of the Alert Level of Kanlaon Volcano from Alert Level 2 (increasing unrest) to Alert Level 3 (magmatic unrest) means that a magmatic eruption has begun and may progress to further explosive eruptions. All local government units are advised to evacuate the 6-km radius from the summit of the volcano and must be prepared for additional evacuation if activity warrants.

## II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **10,705 families** or **43,740 persons** are affected in **26 barangays** in **Regions VI and VII** (see Annex A).



### III. Status of Displaced Population

#### a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are **3,977 families** or **11,712 persons** currently taking temporary shelter in **27 evacuation centers** in **Regions VI** and **VII** (see Annex B).

#### b. Outside Evacuation Center

There are **694 families** or **2,366 persons** temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex E).

#### c. Total Displaced Population

There are **4,671 families** or **14,078 persons** still displaced in **Regions VI** and **VII** (see Annex F).

### IV. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of **₱28,510,663.53** worth of assistance was provided to the affected families composed of **₱19,996,735.00** from **DSWD**, **₱8,013,928.53** from the **Local Government Units (LGUs)**, and **₱500,000.00** from **Non-Government Organizations (NGOs)** (see Annex G).
