

DSWD DROMIC Report #12 on the Effects of Shear Line

as of 03 January 2025, 6AM

I. Situation Overview

On 01 December 2024, several municipalities in the provinces of Capiz and Aklan in Western Visayas and municipalities in the provinces of Albay, Camarines Norte, Camarines Sur, and Catanduanes in Bicol Region experienced incidents of flooding and landslides due to the effects of Shear Line.

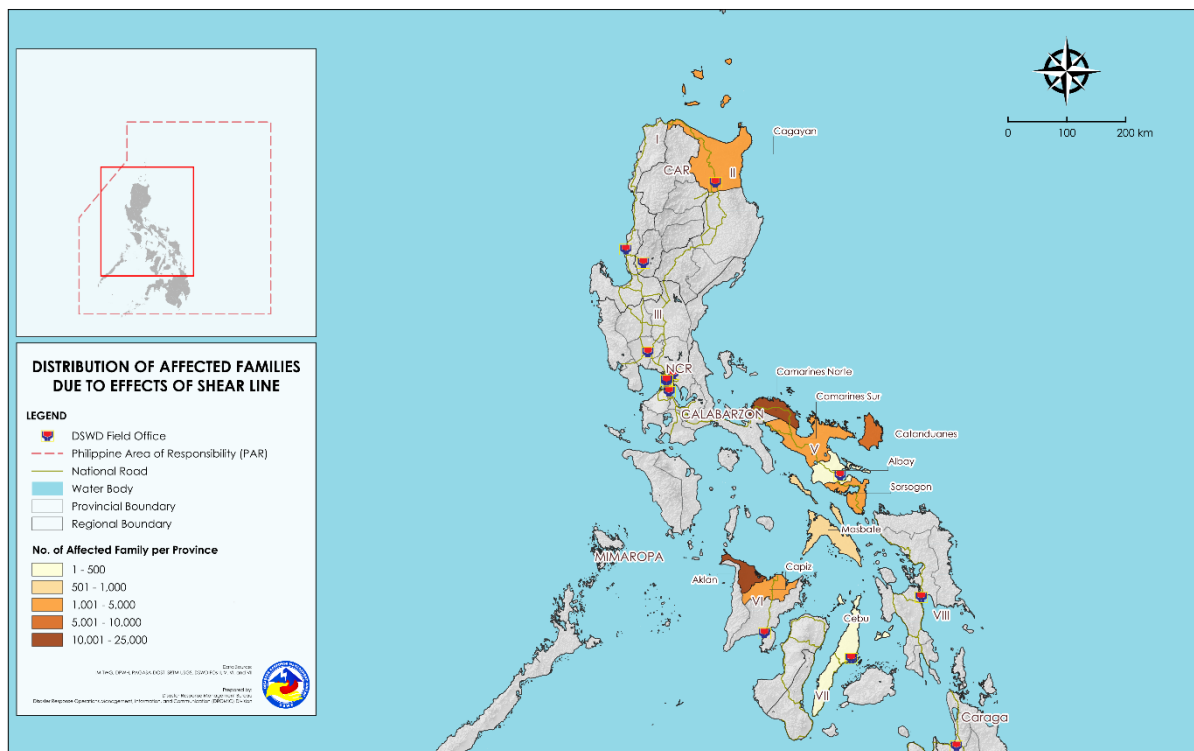
On 02 December 2024, flooding, landslides, and other incidents related to the effects of Shear Line were reported in Cebu City.

On 04 December 2024, the effects of Shear Line were also reported in Tuguegarao City, Cagayan.

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **57,171 families** or **240,483 persons** are affected in **434 barangays** in **Regions II, V, VI and VII** (see Annex A).



III. Status of Displaced Population

a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are **455 families** or **1,674 persons** currently taking temporary shelter in **12 evacuation centers** in **Regions II, V, and VI** (see Annex B).

b. Outside Evacuation Center

One (1) family or **four (4) persons** are temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex C).

c. Total Displaced Population

There are **456 families** or **1,678 persons** still displaced in **Regions II, V, and VI** (see Annex D).

IV. Damaged Houses

A total of **49 houses** were damaged; of which, **13 are totally damaged** and **36 are partially damaged** in **Regions V, VII and VII** (see Annex E).

V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of **₱6,334,899.00** worth of assistance was provided to the affected families composed of **₱5,291,399.00** from **DSWD** and **₱1,043,500.00** from the **Local Government Units (LGUs)** (see Annex F).
