

DSWD DROMIC Report #2 on Kanlaon Volcano Eruption as of 10 December 2024, 6PM

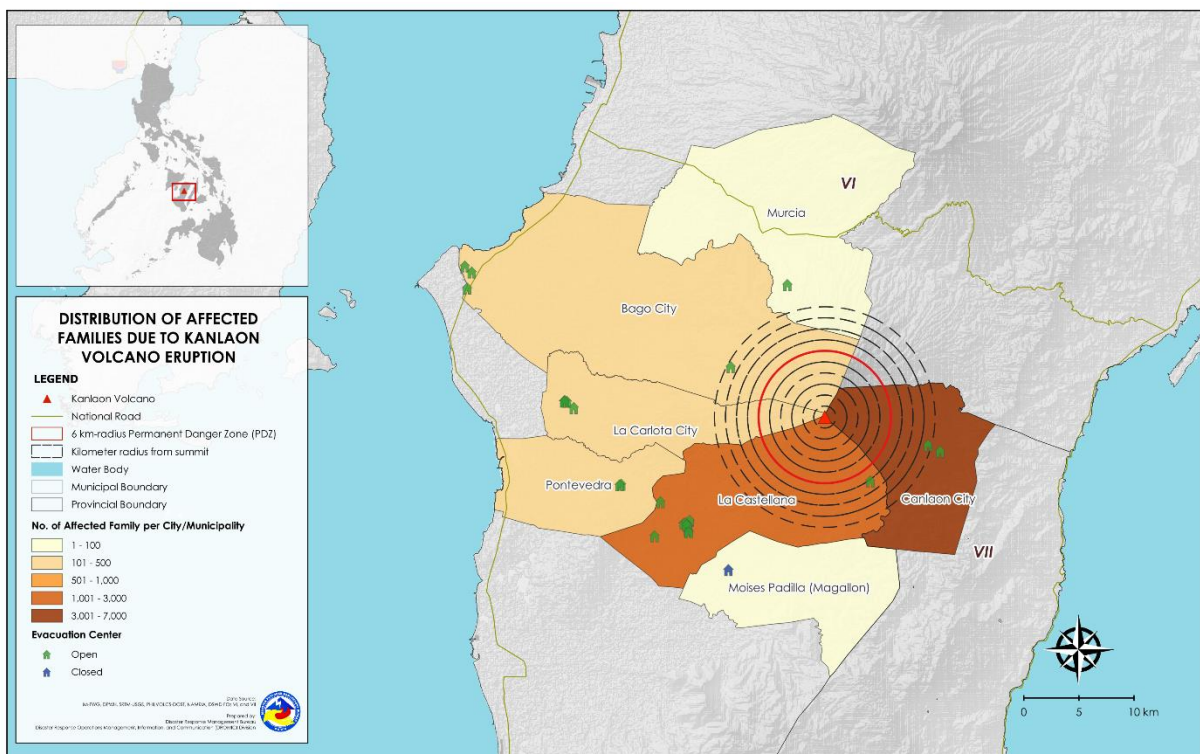
I. Situation Overview

- As of **10 December 2024**, Kanlaon Volcano remains under **Alert Level 3**.
- On 09 December 2024 at 3:03PM, Alert Level 3 was raised from Alert Level 2 over the Kanlaon Volcano after an explosive eruption that occurred at the summit vent. The eruption produced a voluminous plume that rapidly rose to 3,000 meters above the vent and drifted west-southwest. Pyroclastic density currents (PDCs) descended the slopes on the general southeastern edifice based on IP and thermal camera monitors.
- The raising of the Alert Level of Kanlaon Volcano from Alert Level 2 (increasing unrest) to Alert Level 3 (magmatic unrest) means that a magmatic eruption has begun and may progress to further explosive eruptions. All local government units are advised to evacuate the 6-km radius from the summit of the volcano and must be prepared for additional evacuation if activity warrants.

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **10,298 families** or **35,340 persons** are affected in **23 barangays** in **Regions VI and VII** (see Annex A).



III. Status of Displaced Population

a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are **3,572 families** or **12,010 persons** currently taking temporary shelter in **24 evacuation centers** in **Regions VI** and **VII** (see Annex B).

b. Outside Evacuation Center

There are **44 families** or **162 persons** temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex D).

c. Total Displaced Population

There are **3,616 families** or **12,172 persons** still displaced in **Regions VI** and **VII** (see Annex E).

IV. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of **₱1,543,582.00** worth of assistance from **DSWD** was provided to the affected families (see Annex F).

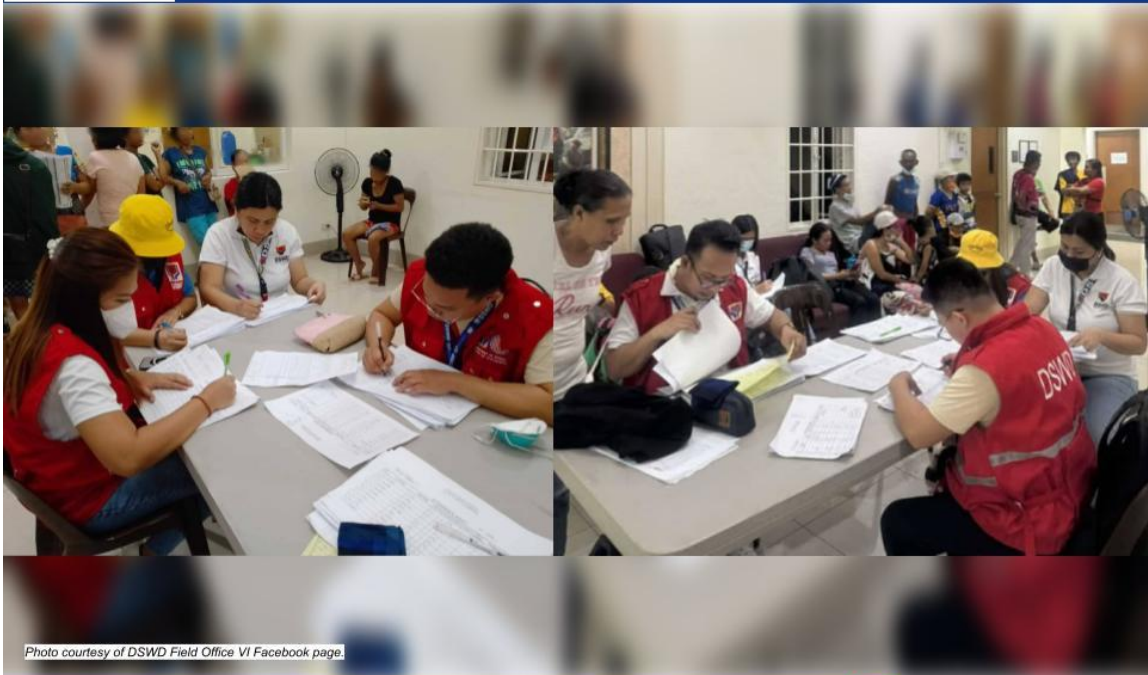
