

DSWD DROMIC Report #2 on Tropical Depression “Romina” as of 23 December 2024, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

Issued on 23 December 2024 at 5:00 AM, “Romina” continues to move northwestward slowly and is no longer directly affecting Kalayaan islands.

HAZARDS AFFECTING LAND AREAS

Heavy Rainfall Outlook

Refer to Weather Advisory No. 30 issued at 5:00 AM today for the heavy rainfall outlook due to Shear Line and Trough of Tropical Cyclone (Formerly “Romina”).

Severe Winds

The channeling of winds coming from the trough of the Tropical Depression (formerly “Romina”) and the northeast monsoon will bring strong to gale-force gusts over the following areas (especially in coastal and upland areas exposed to winds):

- Today (23 December): Batanes, Babuyan Islands, Ilocos Norte, Aurora, Bataan, Batangas, Cavite, Quezon, Oriental Mindoro, Lubang Islands, Calamian Islands, Cuyo Islands, Kalayaan Islands, Camarines Norte, Camarines Sur, Catanduanes, and Caluya Islands.

HAZARD AFFECTING COASTAL WATERS

A Gale Warning is hoisted over the northern and western seaboard of Northern Luzon and the western seaboard of Southern Luzon. Refer to Gale Warning No. 11 issued at 5:00 AM today for the details.

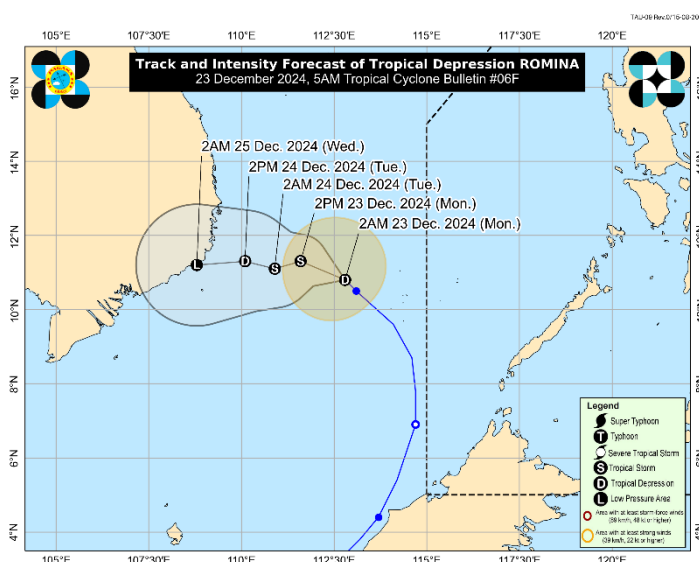
24-Hour Sea Condition Outlook

Up to very rough seas over the following coastal waters:

- Up to 4.5 m: The seaboard of Batanes, Babuyan Islands, and Ilocos Norte.
- Sea travel is risky for all types or tonnage of vessels. All mariners must remain in port or, if underway, seek shelter or safe harbor as soon as possible until winds and waves subside.

Up to rough seas over the following coastal waters:

- Up to 4.0 m: The seaboard of Cagayan, Isabela, northern Aurora, Camarines Norte, and Kalayaan Islands; the northern and eastern seaboard of Polillo Islands and Catanduanes; the northern seaboard of Camarines Sur.



- Up to 3.5 m: The seaboard of Isabela, Aurora, and northern mainland Quezon; the eastern seaboard of Albay, Sorsogon, and Eastern Samar; the northern and eastern seaboard of Northern Samar; the remaining seaboard of Ilocos Region and Aurora.
- Up to 3.0 m: The western seaboard of Lubang Islands.
- Mariners of small seacrafts, including all types of motorbancas, are advised not to venture out to sea under these conditions, especially if inexperienced or operating ill-equipped vessels.

Up to moderate seas over the following coastal waters:

- Up to 2.5 m: The seaboard of Palawan; the eastern seaboard of Camarines Sur, Dinagat Islands, and Surigao del Sur; the remaining seaboard of Catanduanes; the western seaboard of Zambales, Bataan, Batangas, Occidental Mindoro, and Antique.
- Up to 2.0 m: The eastern seaboard of Davao Oriental; the eastern seaboard of mainland Quezon.
- Mariners of motorbancas and similarly-sized vessels are advised to take precautionary measures while venturing out to sea and, if possible, avoid navigation under these conditions.

TRACK AND INTENSITY OUTLOOK

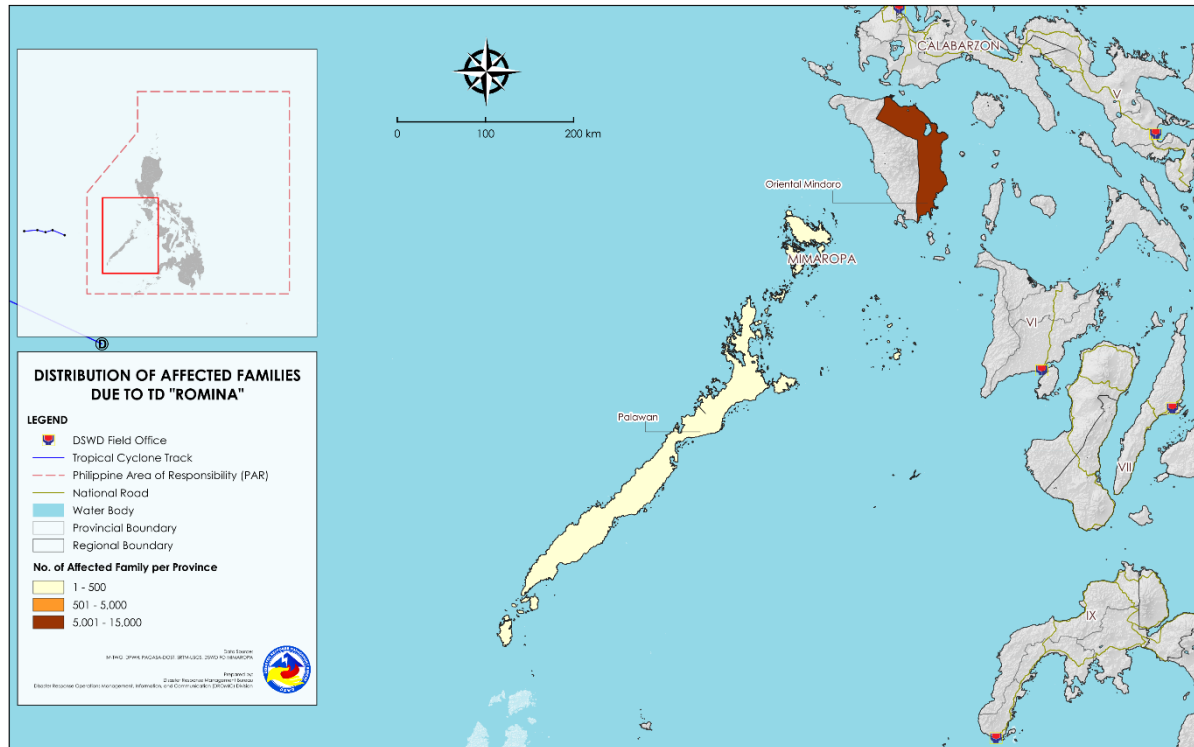
- Although “Romina” is moving slowly, Kalayaan Islands are no longer within its radius and are therefore no longer directly affected by the tropical depression.
- “Romina” is forecast to move generally westward within the forecast period. It is expected to continue moving away from the islands while heading towards the eastern coast of Vietnam.
- “Romina” may reach tropical storm category within the next 12 hours and may weaken into a tropical depression tonight or tomorrow (24 December) early morning. It may further weaken into a remnant low as it approaches Vietnam.
- It must be emphasized that the track may still shift within the limit of the forecast confidence cone as the tropical cyclone continues to further organize.

The center of Tropical Depression “Romina” was estimated based on all available data at 165 km West of Pag-asa Island, Kalayaan, Palawan (OUTSIDE PAR) (10.8°N, 112.8°E) while moving Northwestward at 10 km/h with maximum sustained winds of 55 km/h near the center and gustiness of up to 70 km/h.

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **12,662 families** or **38,841 persons** are affected in **39 barangays** in **MIMAROPA** (see Annex A).



III. Status of Displaced Population

a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are **218 families** or **867 persons** currently taking temporary shelter in **11 evacuation centers** in **MIMAROPA** (see Annex B).

b. Outside Evacuation Center

There are **284 families** or **1,313 persons** temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex C).

c. Total Displaced Population

There are **502 families** or **2,180 persons** displaced in **MIMAROPA** (see Annex D).

IV. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of **₱1,779,800.00** worth of assistance was provided by **DSWD** to the affected families (see Annex E).

1. Standby Funds

- ₱23.85 million Quick Response Fund (QRF) at the DSWD Central Office.
- ₱3 million available at DSWD FO MIMAROPA.
- ₱44 million available in other DSWD FOs which may support the relief needs of the families affected by Tropical Depression (TD) “Romina” through inter-FO augmentation.

2. Prepositioned FFPs and Other Relief Items

- 270,507 FFPs available in Disaster Response Centers; of which, 127,037 FFPs are at the National Resource Operations Center (NROC), Pasay City and 143,470 FFPs are at the Visayas Disaster Resource Center (VDRC), Mandaue City.
- 94,998 FFPs available at DSWD FO MIMAROPA.
- 1,145,464 FFPs in other DSWD FOs which may support the relief needs of the families affected by the effects of TD “Romina” through inter-FO augmentation.
- ₱876.52 million worth of other FNIs at NROC, VDRC, and DSWD FO warehouses.
