





# **DSWD DROMIC Report #2 on the Effects of Shear Line**

as of 03 December 2024, 6AM

# I. Situation Overview

On 01 December 2024 at 4AM, cloudy skies with scattered rains and thunderstorms caused by Shear Line might have caused possible flash floods or landslides to moderate to heavy rains in Metro Manila, CALABARZON, Bicol Region, Eastern Visayas, Western Visayas, Bulacan, Oriental Mindoro, Marinduque, Romblon, Negros Occidental, and Cebu.


On the same day, low-lying areas in Capiz and several municipalities in the Bicol Region experienced landslides and flooding caused by the continuous and intense rainfall.

Furthermore, the effects of the Shear line were also experienced in the Central Visayas Region.

# II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of 4,865 families or 22,015 persons are affected in 105 barangays in Regions V, VI and VII (see Annex A).









# III. Status of Displaced Population

#### a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are **657 families** or **2,354 persons** currently taking temporary shelter in **44 evacuation centers** in **Regions V** and **VI** (see Annex B).

#### b. Outside Evacuation Center

There are **312 families** or **1,486 persons** temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex D).

#### c. Total Displaced Population

There are **969 families** or **3,840 persons** still displaced in **Regions V**, **VI**, and **VII** (see Annex E).

# IV. Damaged Houses

A total of 13 houses were damaged; of which, three (3) are totally damaged and 10 are partially damaged in Regions V and VII (see Annex F).

#### 1. Standby Funds

- 336,279 FFPs available at DSWD FO V, VI, and VII.
- 978,871 FFPs in other DSWD FOs which may support the relief needs of the families affected by the Effects of Shear Line.
