

# **DSWD DROMIC Report #22 on Kanlaon Volcano Eruption**

as of 20 December 2024, 6PM


### I. Situation Overview

- As of 20 December 2024, Kanlaon Volcano remains under Alert Level 3.
- On 09 December 2024 at 3:03 PM, Alert Level 3 was raised from Alert Level 2 over the Kanlaon Volcano after an explosive eruption that occurred at the summit vent. The eruption produced a voluminous plume that rapidly rose to 3,000 meters above the vent and drifted west-southwest. Pyroclastic density currents (PDCs) descended the slopes on the general southeastern edifice based on IP and thermal camera monitors.
- The raising of the Alert Level of Kanlaon Volcano from Alert Level 2 (increasing unrest) to Alert Level 3 (magmatic unrest) means that a magmatic eruption has begun and may progress to further explosive eruptions. All local government units are advised to evacuate the 6-km radius from the summit of the volcano and must be prepared for additional evacuation if activity warrants.

## II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **11,859 families** or **47,021 persons** are affected in **26 barangays** in **Regions VI** and **VII** (see Annex A).





### III. Status of Displaced Population

#### a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are **4,657 families** or **14,797 persons** currently taking temporary shelter in **31 evacuation centers** in **Regions VI** and **VII** (see Annex B).

#### b. Outside Evacuation Center

There are **2,010 families** or **6,487 persons** temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex E).

#### c. Total Displaced Population

There are **6,667 families** or **21,284 persons** still displaced in **Regions VI** and **VII** (see Annex F).

### IV. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of ₱52,057,017.94 worth of assistance was provided to the affected families; of which, ₱43,519,719.41 from DSWD, ₱8,037,298.53 from the Local Government Units (LGUs), and ₱500,000.00 from Non-Government Organizations (NGOs) (see Annex G).
