





DSWD DROMIC Report #3 on Kanlaon Volcano Eruption

as of 11 December 2024, 6AM


I. Situation Overview

- As of 11 December 2024, Kanlaon Volcano remains under Alert Level 3.
- On 09 December 2024 at 3:03PM, Alert Level 3 was raised from Alert Level 2 over the Kanlaon Volcano after an explosive eruption that occurred at the summit vent. The eruption produced a voluminous plume that rapidly rose to 3,000 meters above the vent and drifted west-southwest. Pyroclastic density currents (PDCs) descended the slopes on the general southeastern edifice based on IP and thermal camera monitors.
- The raising of the Alert Level of Kanlaon Volcano from Alert Level 2 (increasing unrest) to Alert Level 3 (magmatic unrest) means that a magmatic eruption has begun and may progress to further explosive eruptions. All local government units are advised to evacuate the 6-km radius from the summit of the volcano and must be prepared for additional evacuation if activity warrants.

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of 10,993 families or 37,699 persons are affected in 23 barangays in Regions VI and VII (see Annex A).





III. Status of Displaced Population

a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are 3,724 families or 12,368 persons currently taking temporary shelter in 29 evacuation centers in Regions VI and VII (see Annex B).

b. Outside Evacuation Center

There are **585 families** or **2,150 persons** temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex D).

c. Total Displaced Population

There are 4,309 families or 14,518 persons still displaced in Regions VI and VII (see Annex E).

IV. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of **P4,399,028.20** worth of assistance from **DSWD** was provided to the affected families (see Annex F).

1. Standby Funds

- ₱46.75 million Quick Response Fund (QRF) at the DSWD Central Office.
- ₱6 million available at DSWD FO VI and VII.
- ₱41.62 million available in other DSWD FOs which may support the relief needs of the families affected by the Kanlaon Volcano eruption through inter-FO augmentation.

09 December 2024	 DSWD FO VII, through its City Municipal Action Team, conducted a site visit at the evacuation centers and provided technical support on CCCM, data validation and monitoring to the LGU of Canlaon City.

11 December 2024	 DSWD Secretary Rex Gatchalian, together with Disaster Response Management Group (DRMG) Undersecretary Diana Rose Cajipe, DSWD FO VI Regional Director (RD) Arwin Razo, DSWD FO VII RD Shalaine Marie Lucero, and key LGU officials, visited the evacuation centers to distribute FNIs and personally assess the needs of the families and persons displaced by the most recent eruption of the Kanlaon Volcano. The Disaster Response Management Bureau (DRMB) closely coordinates and collaborates with the DSWD FOs and other concerned Offices / Bureaus / Sections / Units (OBSUs) to monitor and oversee the release of FFPs to the affected LGUs intended for distribution to the families affected by the Kanlaon Volcano eruption. DRMB actively coordinates with the DSWD FOs to ensure the implementation of effective disaster response activities. DRMB maintains close collaboration with the Department of Science and Technology – Philippine Institute of Volcanology and Seismology (DOST-PHIVOLCS) for significant updates on the Kanlaon Volcano eruption. All members of the DRMB Quick Response Team (QRT) and emergency equipment are on standby and ready for deployment. DRMB through the DSWD Disaster Response Command Center (DRCC) closely coordinates with the National Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Operations Center (NDRRMOC)
	and other concerned offices for significant updates and other related information on the Kanlaon Volcano eruption.
	The National Resource and Logistics Management Bureau (NRLMB) ensures the replenishment and availability of FNIs for resource augmentation to DSWD FOs as needed.
