



DSWD DROMIC Report #3 on the Effects of Shear Line

as of 03 December 2024, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

On 01 December 2024 at 4AM, cloudy skies with scattered rains and thunderstorms caused by Shear Line might have caused possible flash floods or landslides to moderate to heavy rains in Metro Manila, CALABARZON, Bicol Region, Eastern Visayas, Western Visayas, Bulacan, Oriental Mindoro, Marinduque, Romblon, Negros Occidental, and Cebu.


On the same day, low-lying areas in Capiz and several municipalities in the Bicol Region experienced landslides and flooding caused by the continuous and intense rainfall.

Furthermore, the effects of the Shear line were also experienced in the Central Visayas Region.

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **13,192 families** or **55,622 persons** are affected in **194 barangays** in **Regions V, VI** and **VII** (see Annex A).







III. Status of Displaced Population

a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are **431 families** or **1,445 persons** currently taking temporary shelter in **31 evacuation centers** in **Regions V** and **VI** (see Annex B).

b. Outside Evacuation Center

There are **26 families** or **95 persons** temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex C).

c. Total Displaced Population

There are **457 families** or **1,540 persons** still displaced in **Regions V**, **VI**, and **VII** (see Annex D).

IV. Damaged Houses

A total of **42** houses were damaged; of which, **eight (8)** are **totally damaged** and **34** are **partially damaged** in **Regions V** and **VII** (see Annex E).

V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of **₱857,900.00** worth of assistance was provided by the Local Government Units (LGUs) to the affected families (see Annex F).
