

DSWD DROMIC Report #3 on the Effects of Shear Line in Visayas

as of 24 December 2024, 6PM

I. Situation Overview


On 21 December 2024, several municipalities in the province of Negros Occidental experienced flooding in low-lying areas caused by heavy rains due to the effects of Shear Line affecting Southern Luzon and Visayas.

On 23 December 2024, provinces of Eastern Samar, Samar, and Northern Samar experienced moderate to heavy flooding caused by heavy rains due to the effects of Shear Line. Further, minor soil erosion has also occurred in the provinces of Eastern and Northern Samar.

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **43,426 families** or **160,731 persons** are affected in **200 barangays** in **Regions VI** and **VIII** (see Annex A).



III. Status of Displaced Population

a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are **2,575 families** or **9,671 persons** currently taking temporary shelter in **55 evacuation centers** in **Regions VI** and **VIII** (see Annex B).



b. Outside Evacuation Center

There are **1,592 families** or **5,437 persons** temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex C).

c. Total Displaced Population

There are **4,167 families** or **15,108 persons** still displaced in **Regions VI** and **VIII** (see Annex D).

IV. Damaged Houses

A total of **10** houses were damaged; of which, one (1) is totally damaged and nine (9) are partially damaged in Regions VI and VIII (see Annex E).

V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of ₱2,020,386.40 worth of assistance was provided to the affected families; of which, ₱1,070,386.40 from DSWD and ₱950,000.00 from the Local Government Unit (LGU) (see Annex F).

- 1,056,346 FFPs in other DSWD FOs which may support the relief needs of the families affected by the Effects of Shear Line.
