





# **DSWD DROMIC Report #4 on Kanlaon Volcano Eruption**

as of 11 December 2024, 6PM


#### **Situation Overview** I.

- As of 11 December 2024, Kanlaon Volcano remains under Alert Level 3.
- On 09 December 2024 at 3:03PM, Alert Level 3 was raised from Alert Level 2 over the Kanlaon Volcano after an explosive eruption that occurred at the summit vent. The eruption produced a voluminous plume that rapidly rose to 3,000 meters above the vent and drifted west-southwest. Pyroclastic density currents (PDCs) descended the slopes on the general southeastern edifice based on IP and thermal camera monitors.
- The raising of the Alert Level of Kanlaon Volcano from Alert Level 2 (increasing unrest) to Alert Level 3 (magmatic unrest) means that a magmatic eruption has begun and may progress to further explosive eruptions. All local government units are advised to evacuate the 6-km radius from the summit of the volcano and must be prepared for additional evacuation if activity warrants.

#### II. **Status of Affected Areas and Population**

A total of 11,742 families or 40,363 persons are affected in 24 barangays in Regions VI and VII (see Annex A).





# III. Status of Displaced Population

#### a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are 3,970 families or 13,274 persons currently taking temporary shelter in 25 evacuation centers in Regions VI and VII (see Annex B).

#### b. Outside Evacuation Center

There are **650 families** or **2,421 persons** temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex E).

#### c. Total Displaced Population

There are 4,620 families or 15,695 persons still displaced in Regions VI and VII (see Annex F).

## IV. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of ₱5,990,528.20 worth of assistance was provided to the affected families; of which, ₱4,490,528.20 from DSWD, ₱1,000,000.00 from the Local Government Unit (LGU), and ₱500,000.00 from Non-Governmen Organizations (NGOs) (see Annex F).
