

DSWD DROMIC Report #4 on the Effects of Shear Line

as of 05 December 2024, 6AM

I. Situation Overview

On 01 December 2024 at 4AM, cloudy skies with scattered rains and thunderstorms caused by Shear Line may have caused possible flash floods or landslides to moderate to heavy rains in Metro Manila, CALABARZON, Bicol Region, Eastern Visayas, Western Visayas, Bulacan, Oriental Mindoro, Marinduque, Romblon, Negros Occidental, and Cebu.

On the same day, low-lying areas in Capiz and several municipalities in Bicol Region experienced landslides and flooding caused by the continuous and intense rainfall.

Furthermore, the effects of Shear Line were also experienced in the Central Visayas.

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **24,729 families** or **101,806 persons** are affected in **243 barangays** in **Regions V**, **VI** and **VII** (see Annex A).





III. Status of Displaced Population

a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are **210 families** or **760 persons** currently taking temporary shelter in **15 evacuation centers** in **Regions V** and **VI** (see Annex B).

b. Outside Evacuation Center

There are **22 families** or **80 persons** temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex C).

c. Total Displaced Population

There are **232 families** or **840 persons** still displaced in **Regions V**, **VI**, and **VII** (see Annex D).

IV. Damaged Houses

A total of **47 houses** were damaged; of which,**13** are **totally damaged** and **34** are **partially damaged** in **Regions V** and **VII** (see Annex E).

V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of ₱2,098,894.84 worth of assistance was provided to the affected families; of which, ₱1,238,394.84 from DSWD and ₱860,500.00 from the Local Government Units (LGUs) (see Annex F).
