

# **DSWD DROMIC Report #4 on the Effects of Shear Line in Visayas**

as of 25 December 2024, 6AM

## I. Situation Overview


On 21 December 2024, several municipalities in the province of Negros Occidental experienced flooding in low-lying areas caused by heavy rains due to the effects of Shear Line affecting Southern Luzon and Visayas.

On 23 December 2024, provinces of Eastern Samar, Samar, and Northern Samar experienced moderate to heavy flooding caused by heavy rains due to the effects of Shear Line. Further, minor soil erosion has also occurred in the provinces of Eastern and Northern Samar.

# II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **55,254 families** or **206,684 persons** are affected in **232 barangays** in **Regions VI** and **VIII** (see Annex A).



# III. Status of Displaced Population

#### a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are **907 families** or **2,706 persons** currently taking temporary shelter in **14 evacuation centers** in **Regions VI** and **VIII** (see Annex B).







#### b. Outside Evacuation Center

There are 1.098 families or 3.372 persons temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex C).

#### c. Total Displaced Population

There are 2,005 families or 6,078 persons still displaced in Regions VI and VIII (see Annex D).

#### IV. **Damaged Houses**

A total of 28 houses were damaged; of which, 12 are totally damaged and 16 are partially damaged in Regions VI and VIII (see Annex E).

#### **Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided** V.

A total of \$\mathbb{P}\_{5},027,106.40\$ worth of assistance was provided to the affected families; of which, ₱4,077,106.40 from DSWD and ₱950,000.00 from the Local Government **Unit (LGU)** (see Annex F).

#### 1. Standby Funds

- 248,207 FFPs available in Disaster Response Centers; of which, 136,637 FFPs are at the National Resource Operations Center (NROC), Pasay City and 111,570 FFPs are at the Visayas Disaster Resource Center (VDRC), Mandaue City.
- 184,276 FFPs available at DSWD FOs VI and VIII.
- 1,056,346 FFPs in other DSWD FOs which may support the relief needs of the families affected by the Effects of Shear Line.
