

DSWD DROMIC Report #5 on the Effects of Shear Line

as of 05 December 2024, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

On 01 December 2024 at 4AM, cloudy skies with scattered rains and thunderstorms caused by Shear Line may have caused possible flash floods or landslides to moderate to heavy rains in Metro Manila, CALABARZON, Bicol Region, Eastern Visayas, Western Visayas, Bulacan, Oriental Mindoro, Marinduque, Romblon, Negros Occidental, and Cebu.


On the same day, low-lying areas in Capiz and several municipalities in Bicol Region experienced landslides and flooding caused by the continuous and intense rainfall.

Furthermore, the effects of Shear Line were also experienced in Central Visayas and Cagayan Valley.

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **25,330 families** or **103,951 persons** are affected in **262 barangays** in **Regions II**, **V**, **VI** and **VII** (see Annex A).





III. Status of Displaced Population

a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are 653 families or 2,370 persons currently taking temporary shelter in 27 evacuation centers in Regions II, V and VI (see Annex B).

b. Outside Evacuation Center

There are **22 families** or **80 persons** temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex C).

c. Total Displaced Population

There are 675 families or 2,450 persons still displaced in Regions II, V, VI, and VII (see Annex D).

IV. Damaged Houses

A total of 49 houses were damaged; of which,13 are totally damaged and 36 are partially damaged in Regions V, VII and VII (see Annex E).

V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of **P2,138,894.84** worth of assistance was provided to the affected families; of which, **P1,278,394.84** from **DSWD** and **P860,500.00** from the **Local Government Units (LGUs)** (see Annex F).

1. Standby Funds

- ₱45.71 million Quick Response Fund (QRF) at the DSWD Central Office.

DRMB closely coordinates with the DSWD Field Offices (FOs) for significant disaster response updates relative to the effects of Shear Line. DRMB closely coordinates with DOST-PAGASA for significant weather updates and other related information relative to the effects of Shear Line. DRMB through the DSWD Disaster Response Command Center (DRCC) closely coordinates with the National Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Operations Center (NDRRMOC) and other concerned offices for significant updates and other related information about the effects of Shear Line. The National Resource and Logistics Management Bureau (NRLMB) ensures the replenishment and availability of FNIs for resource augmentation to DSWD FOs as need arises.
