

## DSWD DROMIC Report #5 on the Flooding Incidents in Cagayan Valley

as of 04 January 2025, 6PM

### I. Situation Overview

Issued on 27 December 2024 at 4:00 AM, cloudy skies with rains caused by the Northeast Monsoon may have brought possible flash floods or landslides due to moderate to at times heavy rains over the Cagayan Valley, Cordillera Administrative Region (CAR), and Ilocos Norte. On the same day, several barangays in the municipalities of Baggao, Lal-lo, and Lasam in the province of Cagayan, experienced flooding due to the Northeast Monsoon.

On 02 January 2025, cloudy skies with scattered rains and isolated thunderstorms caused by Shear Line may have brought possible flash floods or landslides due to moderate to at times heavy rains over Cagayan and Isabela. On the same day, several barangays in the municipality of Roxas, Isabela experienced flooding due to the effects of Shear Line.

### II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **1,177 families** or **4,208 persons** are affected in **21 barangays** in **Region II** (see Annex A).

### III. Status of Displaced Population

#### a. Inside Evacuation Center

A total of **17 families** or **48 persons** sought temporary shelter in **three (3) Evacuation Centers** in **Region II** (see Annex B).

#### b. Outside Evacuation Center

A total of **six (6) families** or **23 persons** temporarily stayed with their relatives or friends (see Annex C).

#### c. Total Displaced Population

A total of **23 families** or **71 persons** were displaced in **Region II** (see Annex D).

### IV. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of **₱235,623.64** worth of assistance was provided by **DSWD** to the affected families (see Annex E).
