

DSWD DROMIC Report #6 on Kanlaon Volcano Eruption as of 12 December 2024, 6PM

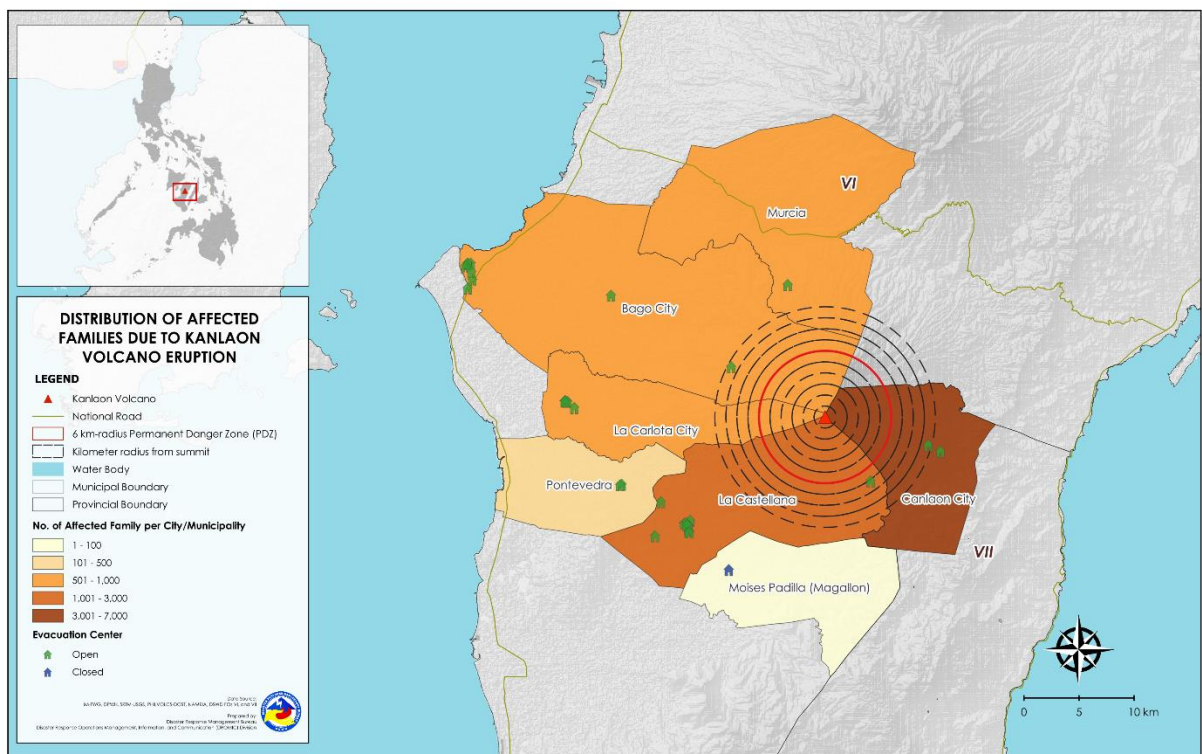
I. Situation Overview

- As of **12 December 2024**, Kanlaon Volcano remains under **Alert Level 3**.
- On 09 December 2024 at 3:03PM, Alert Level 3 was raised from Alert Level 2 over the Kanlaon Volcano after an explosive eruption that occurred at the summit vent. The eruption produced a voluminous plume that rapidly rose to 3,000 meters above the vent and drifted west-southwest. Pyroclastic density currents (PDCs) descended the slopes on the general southeastern edifice based on IP and thermal camera monitors.
- The raising of the Alert Level of Kanlaon Volcano from Alert Level 2 (increasing unrest) to Alert Level 3 (magmatic unrest) means that a magmatic eruption has begun and may progress to further explosive eruptions. All local government units are advised to evacuate the 6-km radius from the summit of the volcano and must be prepared for additional evacuation if activity warrants.

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **11,903 families** or **40,819 persons** are affected in **25 barangays** in **Regions VI** and **VII** (see Annex A).



III. Status of Displaced Population

a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are **4,402 families** or **14,858 persons** currently taking temporary shelter in **25 evacuation centers** in **Regions VI** and **VII** (see Annex B).

b. Outside Evacuation Center

There are **741 families** or **2,722 persons** temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex E).

c. Total Displaced Population

There are **5,143 families** or **17,580 persons** still displaced in **Regions VI** and **VII** (see Annex F).

IV. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of **₱8,817,604.71** worth of assistance was provided to the affected families; of which, **₱7,278,806.20** from **DSWD**, **₱1,038,798.51** from the **Local Government Unit (LGU)**, and **₱500,000.00** from **Non-Government Organizations (NGOs)** (see Annex G).

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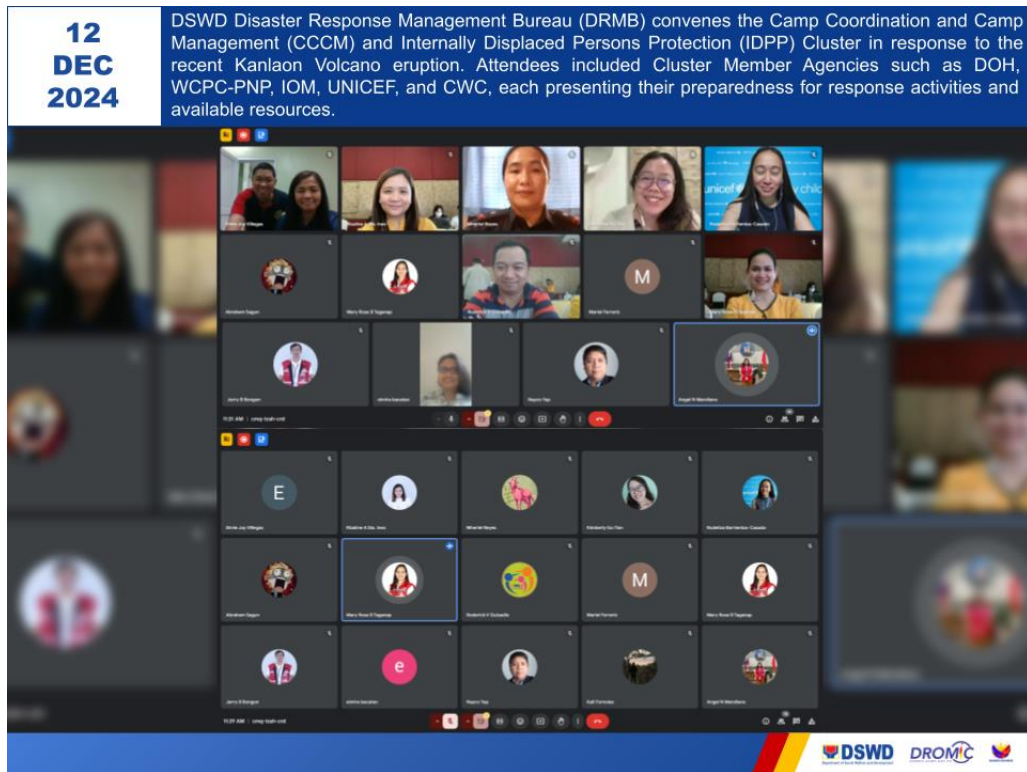
