

DSWD DROMIC Report #6 on Tropical Depression “Romina” as of 30 December 2024, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

On 22 December 2024 at 10:00 AM, Tropical Depression (TD) “Romina” moved North Northeastward towards the Southern Kalayaan Islands. On the same day, at 2:00 PM, it maintained its strength while moving Northward towards the Southern Kalayaan Islands. At 7:00 PM, it was observed to be at the western portion of Kalayaan Islands, and by 11:00 PM, it continued to move northwestward over the West of Kalayaan Islands.

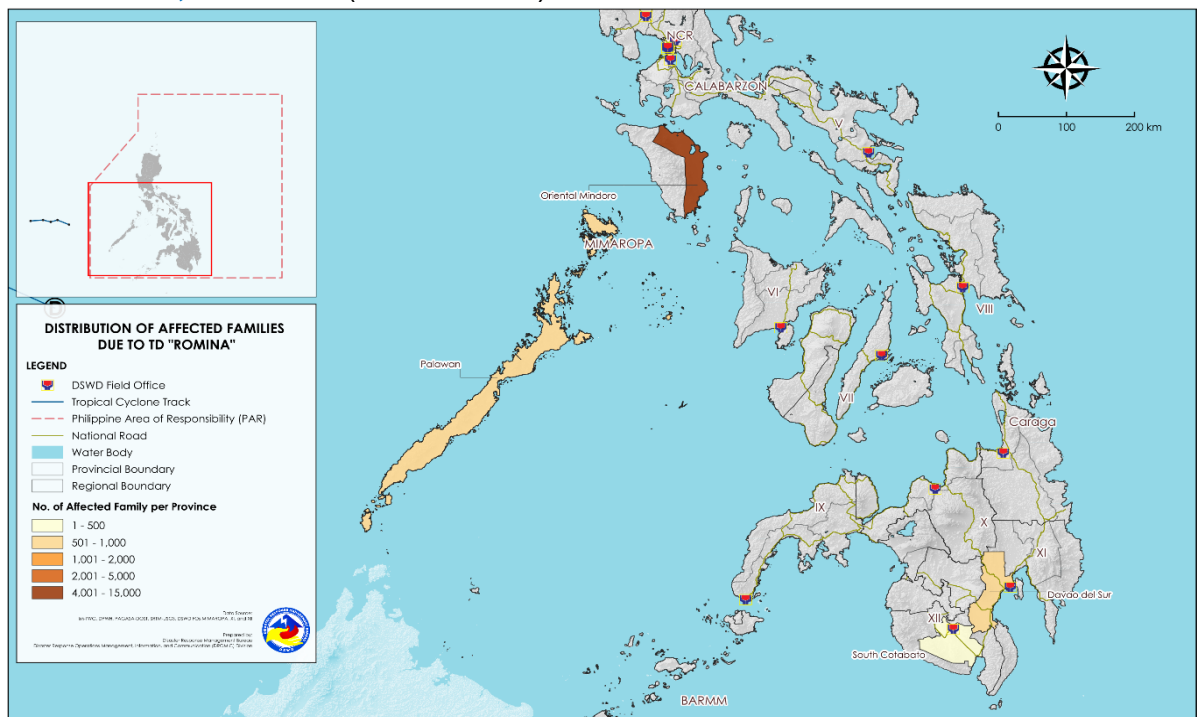
On the same day, some parts of Davao region experienced cloudy skies with scattered rain showers and thunderstorms due to the Trough of TD Romina which led to the flooding incident in Sta. Cruz, Davao del Sur. Further, at around 8:00 PM, a flash flood incident also occurred in two low-lying barangays in Tantaranan, South Cotabato.

On 23 December 2024 at 5:00 AM, TD “Romina” continued to move Northwestward and was no longer directly affecting Kalayaan Islands however, flooding incidents were still reported in the provinces of Palawan and Oriental Mindoro. The reported affected barangays are low lying areas and commonly prone to flooding.

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **16,504 families** or **80,494 persons** are affected in **77 barangays** in **Regions MIMAROPA, XI and XII** (see Annex A).



III. Status of Displaced Population

a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are **35 families** or **150 persons** currently taking temporary shelter in **two (2) evacuation centers** in **MIMAROPA** (see Annex B).

b. Outside Evacuation Center

A total of **743 families** or **3,142 persons** temporarily stayed with their relatives or friends (see Annex C).

c. Total Displaced Population

There are **35 families** or **150 persons** still displaced in **MIMAROPA** (see Annex D).

IV. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of **₱3,559,600.00** worth of assistance was provided by **DSWD** to the affected families (see Annex E).
