

DSWD DROMIC Report #6 on the Effects of Intertropical Convergence Zone (ITCZ) in Mindanao

as of 28 December 2024, 6AM

I. Situation Overview

On 24 November 2024, several barangays in the municipality of Malita, Davao Occidental experienced flooding due to continuous heavy rainfall brought by the ITCZ. At around 7:00 PM, the municipality of Monkayo, Davao De Oro also experienced flooding and landslides due to heavy rains brought by the ITCZ.

On 25 November 2024, a flooding incident was experienced in Brgy. Calagdaan, Cantillan while a landslide incident in Brgy. Tambis, Barobo in Surigao del Sur.

On 29 November 2024, a flooding incident due to heavy rains brought by the ITCZ was also experienced in Brgy. Sta. Isabel, Sta. Filomena and Turno, Dipolog City. On the same day, a flooding incident was experienced in Oroquieta City, Misamis Occidental.

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **1,333 families** or **5,587 persons** are affected in **15 barangays** in **Regions X, IX, XI** and **Caraga** (see Annex A).

III. Status of Displaced Population

- a. Inside Evacuation Center
 A total of 666 families or 2,313 persons sought temporary shelter in nine (9)
 evacuation centers in Regions X and XI (see Annex B).
- b. Outside Evacuation Center There are 611 families or 3,058 persons temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex C).
- c. Total Displaced Population

There are **611 families or 3,058 persons** still displaced in **Regions IX** and **Caraga** (see Annex D).

IV. Damaged Houses

A total of **six (6) houses** were **partially damaged** in **Regions XI** and **Caraga** (see Annex E).



V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of **₱331,857.83** worth of assistance was provided to the affected families; of which, **₱42,457.83** from **DSWD** and **₱289,400.00** from the **Local Government Units (LGUs)** (see Annex F).

1. Standby Funds

- ₱2.21 million Quick Response Fund (QRF) at the DSWD Central Office.
- ₱12 million available at DSWD FOs IX, X, XI and Caraga.
- ₱35 million available in other DSWD FOs which may support the relief needs of the affected families.

2. Prepositioned FFPs and Other Relief Items

- 272,745 FFPs available in Disaster Response Centers; of which, 166,637 FFPs are at the National Resource Operations Center (NROC), Pasay City and 106,108 FFPs are at the Visayas Disaster Resource Center (VDRC), Mandaue City.
- 397,742 FFPs available at DSWD FOs IX, X, XI and Caraga.
- 847,448 FFPs available in other DSWD FOs which may support the relief needs of the affected families.
- ₱914.43 million worth of other FNIs at NROC, VDRC, DSWD FO XI and Caraga warehouses.
