

III. Status of Displaced Population

a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are **852 families** or **2,495 persons** currently taking temporary shelter in **11 evacuation centers** in **Regions VI** and **VIII** (see Annex B).

b. Outside Evacuation Center

There are **1,098 families** or **3,372 persons** temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex C).

c. Total Displaced Population

There are **1,950 families** or **5,867 persons** still displaced in **Regions VI** and **VIII** (see Annex D).

IV. Damaged Houses

A total of **28 houses** were damaged; of which, **12** are **totally damaged** and **16** are **partially damaged** in **Regions VI** and **VIII** (see Annex E).

V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of **₱6,596,066.32** worth of assistance was provided to the affected families composed of **₱5,646,066.32** from **DSWD** and **₱950,000.00** from the **Local Government Unit (LGU)** (see Annex F).
