

DSWD DROMIC Report #7 on the Effects of Shear Line in Visayas

as of 27 December 2024, 6PM

I. Situation Overview


On 21 December 2024, several municipalities in the province of Negros Occidental experienced flooding in low-lying areas caused by heavy rains due to the effects of Shear Line affecting Southern Luzon and Visayas.

On 23 December 2024, the provinces of Eastern Samar, Samar, and Northern Samar experienced moderate to heavy flooding caused by heavy rains due to the effects of Shear Line. Further, minor soil erosion has also occurred in the provinces of Eastern and Northern Samar.

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **70,509 families** or **264,397 persons** are affected in **311 barangays** in **Regions VI** and **VIII** (see Annex A).





III. Status of Displaced Population

a. Inside Evacuation Center There are 852 families or 2,495 persons currently taking temporary shelter in 11 evacuation centers in Regions VI and VIII (see Annex B).

b. Outside Evacuation Center There are 1,098 families or 3,372 persons temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex C).

c. Total Displaced Population

There are **1,950 families** or **5,867 persons** still displaced in **Regions VI** and **VIII** (see Annex D).

IV. Damaged Houses

A total of **28 houses** were damaged; of which, **12** are **totally damaged** and **16** are **partially damaged** in **Regions VI** and **VIII** (see Annex E).

V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of ₱6,596,066.32 worth of assistance was provided to the affected families composed of ₱5,646,066.32 from DSWD and ₱950,000.00 from the Local Government Unit (LGU) (see Annex F).

The National Resource and Logistics Management Bureau (NRLMB) ensures the replenishment and availability of FNIs for resource augmentation to DSWD FOs as need arises.
