

# DSWD DROMIC Report #1 on the Effects of Shear Line

as of 10 January 2025, 6PM

## I. Situation Overview

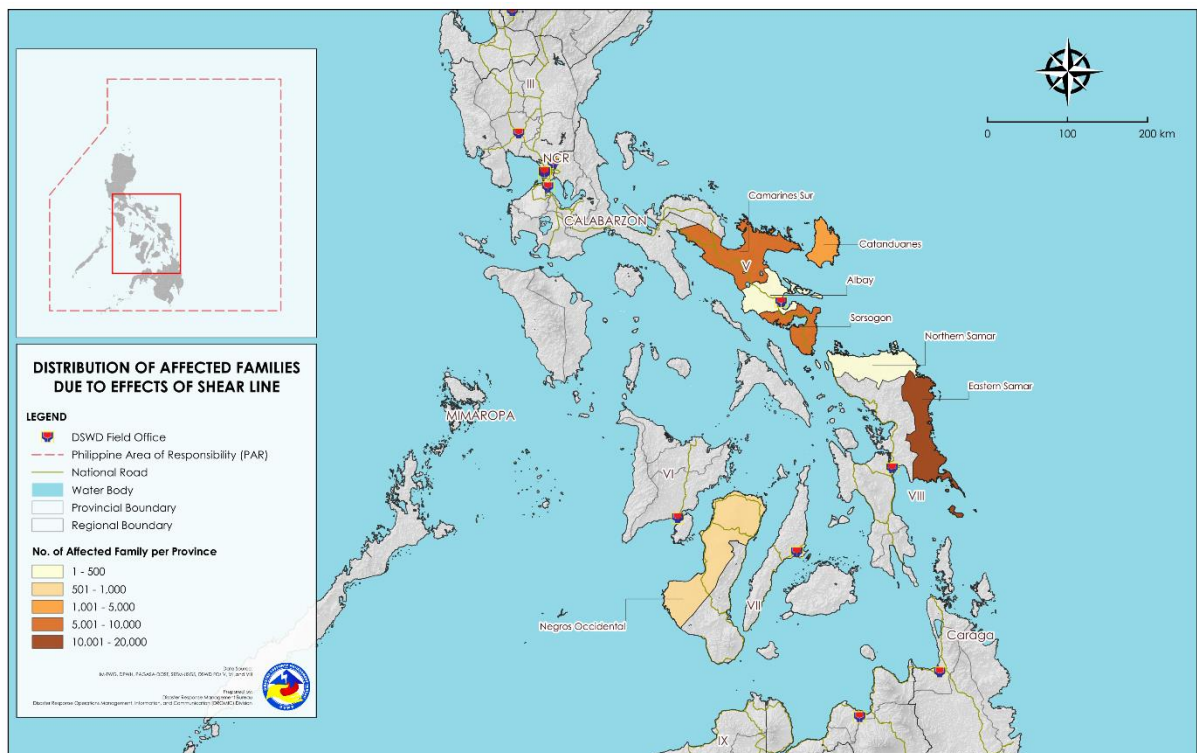
Issued on 08 January 2025 at 4:00 AM, cloudy skies with scattered rains and isolated thunderstorms caused by Shear Line that may have caused possible flash floods or landslides in Visayas, Bicol Region, Quezon, Marinduque, Romblon, and Dinagat Islands.

On the same day, various areas in the provinces of Albay, Sorsogon, Camarines Sur, and Catanduanes experienced intense heavy rainfall and widespread flooding. Moreover, due to continuous heavy rainfall caused by the Shear Line, several flooding and landslide incidents were reported in low-lying barangays in Cadiz City, Negros Occidental including parts of Eastern and Northern Samar.

## II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **30,600 families** or **121,340 persons** are affected in **200 barangays** in **Regions V, VI, and VIII** (see Annex A).



## III. Status of Displaced Population

### a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are **399 families** or **1,737 persons** currently taking temporary shelter in **25 evacuation centers** in **Regions V, VI, and VIII** (see Annex B).

**b. Outside Evacuation Center**

There are **2,707 families** or **9,819 persons** temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex E).

**c. Total Displaced Population**

There are **3,106 families** or **11,556 persons** still displaced in **Regions V, VI, and VIII** (see Annex F).

**IV. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided**

A total of **₱329,500.00** worth of assistance was provided by the **Local Government Unit (LGU)** to the affected families (see Annex E).

**1. Standby Funds**

- ₱3.3 million Quick Response Fund (QRF) at the DSWD Central Office.
- ₱9 million available at DSWD FOs V, VI, and VIII.
- ₱35 million available in other DSWD FOs which may support the relief needs of the families affected by the Effects of Shear Line through inter-FO augmentation.

**2. Prepositioned FFPs and Other Relief Items**

- 362,473 FFPs available in Disaster Response Centers; of which, 141,710 FFPs are at the National Resource Operations Center (NROC), Pasay City and 220,763 FFPs are at the Visayas Disaster Resource Center (VDRC), Mandaue City.
- 383,117 FFPs available at DSWD FO V, VI, and VIII.
- 1,225,274 FFPs available in other DSWD FOs which may support the relief needs of the families affected by the Effects of Shear Line through inter-FO augmentation.
- ₱946.33 million worth of other FNIs at NROC, VDRC, and DSWD FO warehouses.
