

DSWD DROMIC Report #1 on the Fire Incident in Brgy. 459, Sampaloc, Manila City

as of 27 January 2025, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

On 18 January 2025 at around 5:08 AM, a fire incident occurred at Jhocson St., corner Loyola St., Brgy. 459, Zone 45, Sampaloc, Manila City. The fire was declared out at around 6:23 AM.

The result of the validation, indicated 13 totally damaged houses. Likewise, the incident has led to displacement of 69 families' equivalent to 169 individuals. Among them, 14 were identified as solo renters.

In response to the incident, the Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD), through its Field Office in the National Capital Region, extended relief assistance consisting of both food and non-food items to address the immediate needs of the affected populace.

A total of **69 families** or **169 persons** are affected in **Brgy. 459, Sampaloc, Manila City** (see Annex A).

III. Damaged Houses

A total of **13 houses** were **totally damaged** in **Brgy. 459, Sampaloc, Manila City** (see Annex B).

IV. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of **₱39,563.00** worth of assistance was provided by **DSWD** to the affected families (see Annex C).
