

# DSWD DROMIC Report #1 on the Mw 5.9 Earthquake Incident in Southern Leyte

as of 24 January 2025, 6PM

## I. Situation Overview

On 23 January 2025 at around 7:39 AM, a 5.9-magnitude earthquake jolted the Province of Southern Leyte (10.00°N, 125.19°E, 007 km S 29° E).
