

# DSWD DROMIC Report #14 on the Effects of Intertropical Convergence Zone (ITCZ) in Mindanao

as of 09 January 2025, 6PM

## I. Situation Overview

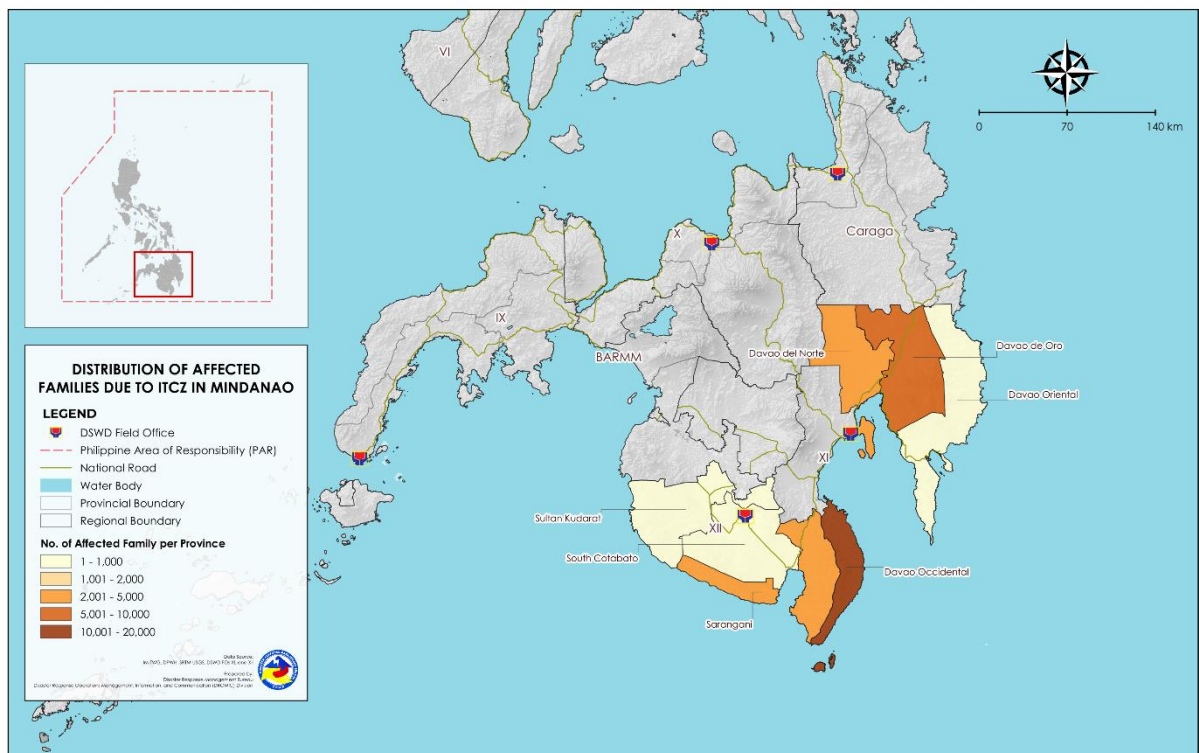
On 25 December 2024, several barangays in the municipalities of Malita and Don Marcelino in Davao Occidental experienced flooding and landslides due to continuous heavy rainfall brought by the ITCZ.

On 26 December 2024, flash flood incidents were experienced in several municipalities in the provinces of Sarangani and Sultan Kudarat due to continuous heavy rains caused by ITCZ.

## II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **30,802 families** or **139,277 persons** are affected in **99 barangays** in **Regions XI and XII** (see Annex A).



## III. Status of Displaced Population

### a. Inside Evacuation Center

A total of **808 families** or **3,493 persons** currently taking temporary shelter in **13 evacuation centers** in **Regions XI and XII** (see Annex B).

**b. Outside Evacuation Center**

There are **404 families** or **2,020 persons** temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex D).

**c. Total Displaced Population**

There are **1,212 families** or **5,513 persons** still displaced in **Regions XI and XII** (see Annex E).

**IV. Damaged Houses**

A total of **1,219 houses** were damaged; of which, **444** are **totally damaged** and **775** are **partially damaged** in **Regions XI and XII** (see Annex F).

**V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided**

A total of **₱24,469,019.00** worth of assistance was provided by **DSWD** to the affected families (see Annex G).

**1. Standby Funds**

- ₱3.3 million Quick Response Fund (QRF) at the DSWD Central Office.
- ₱6 million available at DSWD FOs XI and XII.
- ₱38 million available in other DSWD FOs which may support the relief needs of the families affected by the ITCZ through inter-FO augmentation.
