

DSWD DROMIC Report #14 on the Effects of Shear Line in Visayas

as of 17 January 2025, 6PM

I. Situation Overview


On 21 December 2024, several municipalities in the province of Negros Occidental experienced flooding in low-lying areas caused by heavy rains due to the effects of Shear Line affecting Southern Luzon and Visayas.

On 23 December 2024, the provinces of Eastern Samar, Samar, and Northern Samar experienced moderate to heavy flooding caused by heavy rains due to the effects of Shear Line. Further, minor soil erosion has also occurred in the provinces of Eastern and Northern Samar.

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **78,141 families** or **305,059 persons** are affected in **363 barangays** in **Regions VI** and **VIII** (see Annex A).



III. Status of Displaced Population

a. Inside Evacuation Center

A total of **7,492 families** or **25,910 persons** sought temporary shelter in **126 evacuation centers** in **Regions VI** and **VIII** (see Annex B).



b. Outside Evacuation Center

A total of **3,039 families** or **10,886 persons** temporarily stayed with their relatives or friends (see Annex C).

c. Total Displaced Population

A total of **10,531 families** or **36,796 persons** were displaced in **Regions VI** and **VIII** (see Annex D).

IV. Damaged Houses

A total of **138 houses** were damaged; of which, **19** are **totally damaged** and **119** are **partially damaged** in **Regions VI** and **VIII** (see Annex E).

V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of ₱15,642,305.04 worth of assistance was provided to the affected families composed of ₱14,118,445.04 from DSWD and ₱1,523,860.00 from the Local Government Units (LGUs) (see Annex F).

1. Standby Funds

- ₱3.3 million Quick Response Fund (QRF) available at the DSWD Central Office.
- ₱6 million available at DSWD FOs VI and VIII.
- ₱38 million available in other DSWD FOs which may support the relief needs of the families affected by the effects of Shear Line through inter-FO augmentation.

2. Prepositioned FFPs and Other Relief Items

- 278,880 FFPs available in Disaster Response Centers; of which 157,380 FFPs are at the National Resource Operations Center (NROC), Pasay City and 121,500 FFPs are at the Visayas Disaster Resource Center (VDRC), Mandaue City.
- 264,764 FFPs available at DSWD FOs VI and VIII.

DRMB closely coordinates with the DSWD Field Offices (FOs) for significant disaster response updates relative to the effects of Shear Line in Visayas. DRMB closely coordinates with DOST-PAGASA for significant weather updates and other related information relative to the effects of Shear Line in Visayas. DRMB through the DSWD Disaster Response Command Center (DRCC) closely coordinates with the National Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Operations Center (NDRRMOC) and other concerned offices for significant updates and other related information about the effects of Shear Line in Visayas. The National Resource and Logistics Management Bureau (NRLMB) ensures the replenishment and availability of FNIs for resource augmentation to DSWD FOs as need arises.
