

# **DSWD DROMIC Report #17 on the Effects of Shear Line**

as of 18 February 2025, 6AM

### I. Situation Overview

On 01 December 2024, several municipalities in the provinces of Capiz and Aklan in Western Visayas and municipalities in the provinces of Albay, Camarines Norte, Camarines Sur, and Catanduanes in Bicol Region experienced incidents of flooding and landslides due to the effects of Shear Line.


On 02 December 2024, flooding, landslides, and other incidents related to the effects of Shear Line were reported in Cebu City.

On 04 December 2024, the effects of Shear Line were also reported in Tuguegarao City, Cagayan.

# II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **60,934 families** or **259,167 persons** are affected in **457 barangays** in **Regions II**, **V**, **VI**, and **VII** (see Annex A).





## III. Status of Displaced Population

#### a. Inside Evacuation Center

A total of **2,628 families** or **10,092 persons** sought temporary shelter in **142 evacuation centers** in **Regions II**, **V**, and **VI** (see Annex B).

#### b. Outside Evacuation Center

One (1) family or four (4) persons are temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex C).

### c. Total Displaced Population

One (1) family or four (4) persons still displaced in Cebu City (see Annex D).

## IV. Damaged Houses

A total of **217 houses** were damaged; of which, **11** are **totally damaged** and **206** are **partially damaged** in **Regions V**, **VI**, and **VII** (see Annex E).

### V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of ₱11,456,596.39 worth of assistance has been provided to the affected families; of which, ₱10,368,246.39 from the DSWD and ₱1,088,350.00 from Local Government Units (LGUs) (see Annex F).
