

# **DSWD DROMIC Report #2 on the Effects of Shear Line**

as of 11 January 2025, 6AM

#### I. Situation Overview


Issued on 08 January 2025 at 4AM, cloudy skies with scattered rains and isolated thunderstorms caused by Shear Line that may have caused possible flash floods or landslides in Visayas, Bicol Region, Quezon, Marinduque, Romblon, and Dinagat Islands.

On the same day, various areas in the provinces of Albay, Sorosogon, Camarines Sur, and Catanduanes experienced intense heavy rainfall and widespread flooding. Moreover, due to continuous heavy rainfall caused by the Shear Line, several flooding and landslide incidents were reported in low-lying barangays in Cadiz City, Negros Occidental including parts of Eastern Samar and Northern Samar.

# II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **33,956 families** or **135,373 persons** are affected in **240 barangays** in **Regions V, VI**, and **VIII** (see Annex A).



# III. Status of Displaced Population

#### a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are **956 families** or **3,219 persons** currently taking temporary shelter in **53 evacuation centers** in **Regions V**, **VI**, and **VIII** (see Annex B).



#### b. Outside Evacuation Center

There are 2,795 families or 10,139 persons temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex E).

#### c. Total Displaced Population

There are 3,751 families or 13,358 persons still displaced in Regions V, VI, and VIII (see Annex F).

### IV. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of ₱2,406,580.00 worth of assistance was provided to the affected families; of which, ₱2,077,080.00 from DSWD and ₱329,500.00 from the Local Government Unit (LGU) (see Annex E).

### 1. Standby Funds

- ₱3.3 million Quick Response Fund (QRF) available at the DSWD Central Office.
- ₱9 million available at DSWD FOs V, VI, and VIII.
- ₱35 million available in other DSWD FOs which may support the relief needs of the families affected by the effects of Shear Line through inter-FO augmentation.

## 2. Prepositioned FFPs and Other Relief Items

- 356,859 FFPs available in Disaster Response Centers; of which, 132,710 FFPs are at the National Resource Operations Center (NROC), Pasay City and 224,149 FFPs are at the Visayas Disaster Resource Center (VDRC), Mandaue City.
- 378,431 FFPs available at DSWD FO V, VI, and VIII.
- 1,225,214 FFPs available in other DSWD FOs which may support the relief needs of the families affected by the effects of Shear Line through inter-FO augmentation.
- ₱942.51 million worth of other FNIs at NROC, VDRC, and DSWD FO warehouses.
