

# DSWD DROMIC Report #2 on the Mw 5.9 Earthquake Incident in Southern Leyte

as of 26 January 2025, 6AM

# I. Situation Overview

On 23 January 2025 at around 7:39 AM, a 5.9-magnitude earthquake jolted the Province of Southern Leyte (10.00°N, 125.19°E, 007 km S 29° E).

# II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **460 families** or **1,716 persons** were affected in **37 barangays** in **Southern Leyte** (see Annex A).

# III. Damaged Houses

A total of **398 houses** were damaged; of which, **13** are **totally damaged** and **385** are **partially damaged** in **Southern Leyte** (see Annex B).

#### IV. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of ₱165,139.92 worth of assistance was provided by **DSWD** to the affected families (see Annex C).
