

# DSWD DROMIC Report #3 on the Effects of Easterlies

as of 20 January 2024, 6PM

## I. Situation Overview

Issued on 13 January 2025 at 4:00 PM, cloudy skies with scattered rain showers and thunderstorms were observed, attributed to the Easterlies. These conditions may have led to potential flash floods or landslides, with moderate to heavy rainfall affecting Palawan.

On the same day, the municipalities of Sofronio Española and Brooke's Point in Palawan experienced flooding due to the heavy rains brought by the Easterlies.

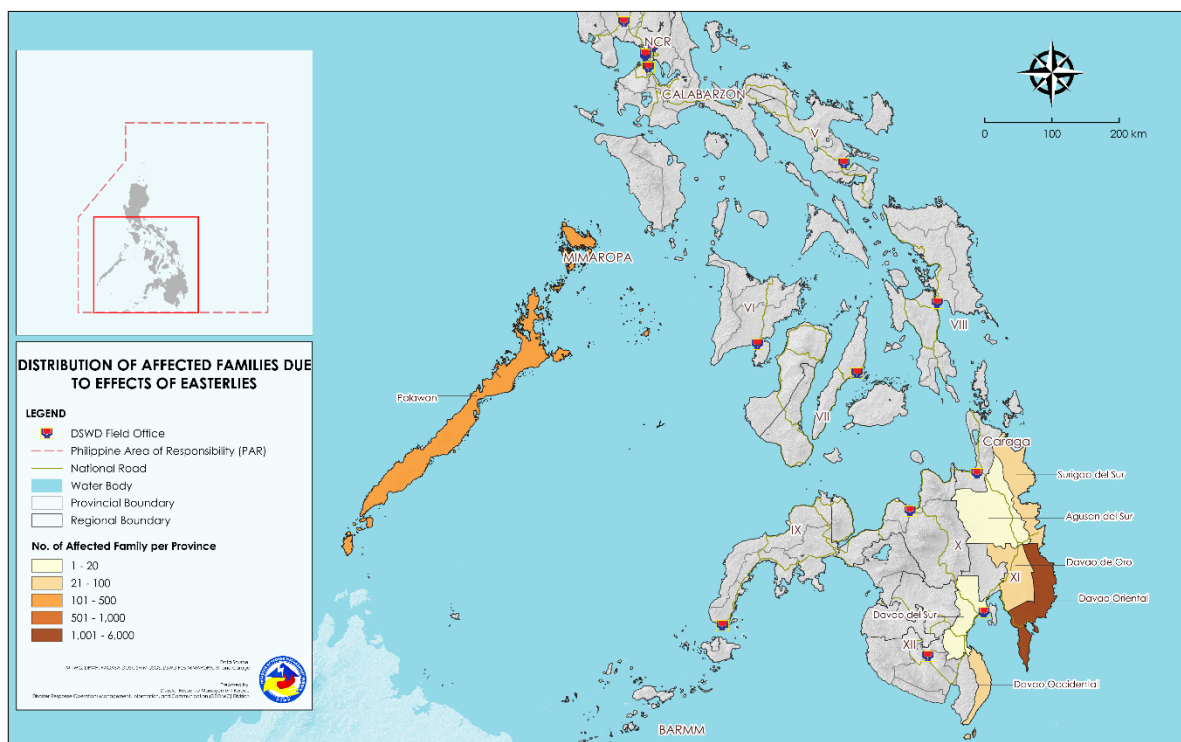
On 14 January 2025, at around 2:00 PM, heavy rainfall associated with the Easterlies resulted in flooding and significant drainage overflow in Barangay Basiawan, Sta. Maria, Davao Occidental.

On 15 January 2025, continued heavy rainfall from the same weather disturbance caused flooding, prompting the evacuation of families in City of Tandag, Hinatuan, Surigao del Sur, and Rosario, Agusan del Norte.

## II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **6,022 families** or **29,618 persons** are affected in **25 barangays** in **Regions MIMAROPA, XI, and Caraga** (see Annex A).



### III. Status of Displaced Population

#### a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are **172 families** or **575 persons** currently taking temporary shelter in **nine (9) evacuation centers** in **Regions MIMAROPA, XI, and Caraga** (see Annex B).

#### b. Outside Evacuation Center

There are **12 families** or **56 persons** temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex C).

#### c. Total Displaced Population

There are **184 families** or **631 persons** still displaced in **Regions MIMAROPA, XI, and Caraga** (see Annex D).

### IV. Damaged Houses

A total of **13 houses** were **partially damaged** in **Regions XI and Caraga** (see Annex E).

#### 1. Standby Funds

- ₱3.30 million Quick Response Fund (QRF) at the DSWD Central Office.
- ₱8 million available at DSWD FO MIMAROPA, XI, and Caraga.
- ₱36 million available in other DSWD FOs which may support the relief needs of the affected families.

#### 2. Prepositioned FFPs and Other Relief Items

- 244,877 FFPs available in Disaster Response Centers; of which, 120,377 FFPs are at the National Resource Operations Center (NROC), Pasay City and 124,500 FFPs are at the Visayas Disaster Resource Center (VDRC), Mandaue City.
- 349,729 FFPs available at DSWD FOs MIMAROPA, XI, and Caraga.

- 1,564,376 FFPs available in other DSWD FOs which may support the relief needs of the affected families.
- ₱927.73 million worth of other FNIs at NROC, VDRC, and DSWD FO MIMAROPA warehouses.
