

# DSWD DROMIC Report #3 on the Mw 5.9 Earthquake Incident in Southern Leyte

as of 27 January 2025, 6PM

# I. Situation Overview

On 23 January 2025 at around 7:39 AM, a 5.9-magnitude earthquake jolted the Province of Southern Leyte (10.00°N, 125.19°E, 007 km S 29° E).

# II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **812 families** or **3,905 persons** were affected in **44 barangays** in **Southern Leyte** (see Annex A).

## III. Status of Displaced Population

#### **Outside Evacuation Center**

There are **14 families** or **56 persons** temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex B).

## IV. Damaged Houses

A total of **772 houses** were damaged; of which, **21** are **totally damaged** and **751** are **partially damaged** in **Southern Leyte** (see Annex C).

# V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of **₱165,139.92** worth of assistance was provided by **DSWD** to the affected families (see Annex D).
