

DSWD DROMIC Report #1 on the Flooding Incident in Eastern Visayas

as of 07 February 2025, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

On 06 February 2025 at around 4:00 AM, cloudy skies with scattered rains and isolated thunderstorms caused by Shear Line may have brought possible flash floods or landslides due to moderate to heavy rains in Visayas, Catanduanes, Albay, Sorsogon, Masbate, Romblon, Dinagat Islands, and Surigao del Norte.

On the same day, several municipalities in Easter Samar experienced flooding due to Shearline.
