

DSWD DROMIC Report #10 on the Effects of Shear Line in Visayas

as of 04 April 2025, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

Issued on 19 March 2025 at around 4:00 AM, cloudy skies with scattered rains and isolated thunderstorms caused by Shear Line may have brought possible flash floods or landslides due to moderate to at times heavy rains in Eastern Visayas, Sorsogon, Masbate, Aklan, and Capiz.

On the same day, due to the continuous heavy rainfall caused by Shear Line, a landslide incident occurred at San Miguel-Babatngon Road, San Miguel, Leyte.

Meanwhile, a flooding incident also occurred at the Wright-Taft-Borongan Road, Brgy. Malinao, Taft. Both incidents led to impassable roads.

On the other hand, at around 10:00 in the evening, heavy rain accompanied by strong winds due to Shear line was also experienced in Brgy. 10, Victorias City in Negros Occidental.

On 20 March 2025 at around 8:00 AM, continuous rainfall brought by the effects of Shear Line was experienced in San Remigio, Cebu and caused the disrupted sea travel of Locally Stranded Individuals (LSIs) at the port of San Remigio.


II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **51,886 families** or **182,703 persons** are affected in **295 barangays** in **Regions VI, VII, and VIII** (see Annex A).









III. Status of Displaced Population

a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are 11 families or 47 persons currently taking temporary shelter in two (2) evacuation centers in Region VIII (see Annex B).

b. Outside Evacuation Center

There are **12 families** or **45 persons** temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex E).

c. Total Displaced Population

There are 23 families or 92 persons still displaced in Region VIII (see Annex F).

IV. Damaged Houses

A total of **16 houses** were damaged; of which, **14** are **totally damaged** and **two (2)** are **partially damaged** in **Region VI** and **VIII** (see Annex G).

V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of \$\frac{1}{25}\$,111,071.82 worth of assistance was provided to the affected families composed of \$\frac{1}{25}\$,109,571.82 from DSWD and \$\frac{1}{25}\$,109.00 from the Local Government Units (LGUs) (see Annex H).
