

DSWD DROMIC Report #109 on Kanlaon Volcano Eruption

as of 13 February 2025, 6PM

I. Situation Overview


- As of 13 February 2025, Kanlaon Volcano remains under Alert Level 3. This means that there are increased chances for sudden and even stronger explosive eruptions to occur and endanger communities at risk with life-threatening volcanic hazards. Communities within a six-kilometer radius of the summit crater must remain evacuated due to the danger of Pyroclastic Density Currents (PDCs), ballistic projectiles and ashfall, lava flows, rockfalls and other related hazards. Local Government Units (LGUs) and Disaster Risk Reduction and Management (DRRM) councils must also vigilantly monitor weather conditions in case heavy rainfall occurs and generates lahars and sediment-laden streamflows in channels draining the southern flanks of the volcano. Specifically, barangays in La Castellana and Canlaon City that have been impacted by PDCs, as well as barangays downstream of these especially those that have experienced lahars and muddy streamflows in June 2024, could be affected by channel-confined lahars of in case of heavy rains.
- On 11 January 2025 at 1:00 PM, a pronounced inflation or swelling of the middle to upper portion of the eastern edifice was observed. Electronic tilt was recorded at 1,056 m elevation on the eastern flank of the volcano showing an abrupt and sharp increase in inflationary tilt since 10 January 2025, indicating a sudden pressurization within the upper portions of the edifice. The overall parameters may indicate that the shallow magma conduit of the volcano is undergoing pressurization that may lead to an eruption.
- On 23 December 2024 at 12:30 PM, an increase in volcanic ash emission at the Kanlaon Volcano was observed. At 11:45 AM, dark ash has been issuing from the summit of Kanlaon Volcano accompanied by a weak low frequency volcanic earthquake. This has produced a dark plume roughly 1.2 kilometers tall that is drifting to the northwest. Ash emission has been ongoing and ashfall is expected to fall over communities of Negros Occidental northwest to west of the volcano. All other parameters of the volcano remain elevated but are generally unchanged.
- On 09 December 2024 at 3:03 PM, Alert Level 3 was raised from Alert Level 2 over the Kanlaon Volcano after an explosive eruption that occurred at the summit vent. The eruption produced a voluminous plume that rapidly rose to 3,000 meters above the vent and drifted west-southwest. Pyroclastic density currents (PDCs) descended the slopes on the general southeastern edifice based on IP and thermal camera monitors.
- The raising of the Alert Level of Kanlaon Volcano from Alert Level 2 (increasing unrest) to Alert Level 3 (magmatic unrest) means that a magmatic eruption has begun and may progress to further explosive eruptions. All LGUs are advised to evacuate the 6-km radius from the summit of the volcano and must be prepared for additional evacuation if activity warrants.

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **12,632 families** or **48,510 persons** are affected in **27 barangays** in **Regions VI** and **VII** (see Annex A).



III. Status of Displaced Population

a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are 2,740 families or 8,723 persons currently taking temporary shelter in 23 evacuation centers in Regions VI and VII (see Annex B).

b. Outside Evacuation Center

There are 3,039 families or 9,805 persons temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex E).

c. Total Displaced Population

A total of **5,779 families** or **18,528 persons** are still displaced in **Regions VI** and **VII** (see Annex F).

IV. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of \$\mathbb{P}\$151,902,293.21 worth of assistance was provided to the affected families composed of \$\mathbb{P}\$94,342,018.44 from DSWD, \$\mathbb{P}\$16,412,168.53 from the Local Government Units (LGUs), \$\mathbb{P}\$32,691,412.24 from Non-Government Organizations (NGOs), and \$\mathbb{P}\$8,456,694.00 from other Partners (see Annex G).
