

DSWD DROMIC Report #11 on the Effects of Shear Line

as of 15 February 2025, 6AM

I. Situation Overview

On 06 February 2025 at around 4:00 AM, cloudy skies with scattered rains and isolated thunderstorms caused by Shear Line may have brought possible flash floods or landslides due to moderate to heavy rains in Visayas, Catanduanes, Albay, Sorsogon, Masbate, Romblon, Dinagat Islands, and Surigao del Norte.

On the same day, several municipalities in Eastern Samar experienced flooding due to Shear Line. Further, continuous heavy rainfall was also experienced in Bicol Region that resulted in a landslide incident in Legazpi City and caused localized flooding in various areas.

On 08-09 February 2025, flooding incidents were experienced in MIMAROPA Region, particularly in several low-lying areas in the municipalities of Baco, Calapan City, Naujan, Socorro and Victoria in Oriental Mindoro, and Aborlan and Narra in Palawan, due to continuous rainfall caused by Shear Line. These incidents led to the displacement of the families residing in the low-lying areas and near the river and lake side.

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **61,845 families** or **230,828 persons** are affected in **387 barangays** in **Regions MIMAROPA**, **V** and **VIII** (see Annex A).





III. Status of Displaced Population

a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are 822 families or 2,992 persons currently taking temporary shelter in 32 evacuation centers in Regions MIMAROPA, V and VIII (see Annex B).

b. Outside Evacuation Center

There are 2,790 families or 10,261 persons temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex C).

c. Total Displaced Population

There are 3,612 families or 13,253 persons still displaced in Regions MIMAROPA, V and VIII (see Annex D).

IV. Damaged Houses

A total of **97 houses** were damaged; of which, **17** are **totally damaged** and **80** are **partially damaged** in **Regions MIMAROPA**, **V** and **VIII** (see Annex E).

V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of ₱12,271,769.18 worth of assistance was provided to the affected families composed of ₱7,377,989.84 from DSWD, ₱3,984,879.34 from the Local Government Unit (LGU), ₱908,900.00 from the other Partners (see Annex F).

1. Standby Funds

- ₱3.30 million Quick Response Fund (QRF) at the DSWD Central Office.
- ₱7.37 million available at DSWD FOs MIMAROPA, V, and VIII.
- ₱35 million available in other DSWD FOs, which may support the relief needs of the families affected by the flooding incidents through inter-FO augmentation.

13 February 2025	 The Disaster Response Management Bureau (DRMB) closely coordinates and collaborates with DSWD FOs and other relevant DSWD Offices/Bureaus/Sections/Units (OBSUs) to monitor and oversee the release of FFPs to the LGUs intended for distribution to the families affected by the effects of Shear Line. The DRMB maintains close coordination with DSWD FOs to receive timely disaster response updates concerning the impacts of the Shear Line. The DRMB works in close partnership with the Department of Science and Technology - Philippine Atmospheric, Geophysical and Astronomical Services Administration (DOST-PAGASA) to obtain significant weather updates and related information regarding the Shear Line's effects. The DRMB, through the DSWD Disaster Response Command Center (DRCC), closely coordinates with the National Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Operations Center (NDRRMOC) and other concerned offices for significant updates and other related information regarding the effects of Shear Line. The National Resource and Logistics Management Bureau (NRLMB) ensures the replenishment and availability of FNIs for resource augmentation to DSWD FOs as need arises.
